Parties to Hearing Order EH-1-2000 -- Option 2 Intervenor

Sumas Energy 2, Inc. (SE2) - Late Intervenor Applications

As of 13 September 2002, the National Energy Board (the Board) had received 66 applications for late intervenor status from individuals, First Nations and governments. At that time the Board forwarded those applications to SE2 for comment. The Board has received comment from SE2 on those 66 applications and approximately 66 more late intervenor applications which have since been filed on SE2 and the Board. Subsequently, 13 more applications have been filed.

The Board has decided to provide those applications to Option 2 Intervenor to allow them to consider whether they wish to submit objections to any of them. Due to the sheer numbers of those applications, the similarity of content of many of them, and recognizing that not all Option 2 Intervenor may wish to object, the Board is providing the attached summary of those letters in table form. The original letters can be found on the Board's website at www.neb-one.gc.ca, search under "View Regulatory Documents", then "Electricity", then, "Sumas Energy 2, Inc." Parties who wish to obtain a copy of a particular application for late intervenor status, and do not have access to the website, may contact Mona Butler, Regulatory Officer at 1-800-899-1265 during office hours, or directly at (403) 299-3928, to request a copy.

Parties filing such objections must indicate the reason for the objection and the nature of any prejudice to them resulting from the granting of late intervenor status to any of those who have applied..

Objections must be filed with the Board and on those individuals whose application for intervenor status is objected to, no later than 5 p.m.(MT) on Wednesday, 2 October 2002. SE 2 will have the same period of time to file any objections to the applications filed since its letter to the Board of 18 September 2002.

Late intervenor applicants will have until 5 p.m (MT), 7 October 2002 to file a reply to any objection to their application.
