Below are my reasons for applying for intervenor status, listed based on the numbering schematics listed above.

4) I would like to examine the potential ecological and human health aspects of this project. Given that I live less than a block from the proposed site, these issues have a direct bearing on the potential quality of my life. As a Ph.D. level biologist, I want to be sure the risk aspects that affect me have been thoroughly researched. The poor response to the 2007 spill from the TransMountain pipeline was concerning.

5) If a tanker spill or pipeline rupture were to occur on the Burrard Inlet, marine life and nearby shorelines would be affected. As someone who enjoys the outdoors, frequently visits shorelines in the area, and kayaks in potentially affected areas, I have a direct interest in ensuring proper safety protocols are met. Again, the 2007 land spill response was disconcerting, and if this were a water spill it would have been even more damaging.

6) Recent publications in local newspapers suggest that Kinder Morgan is now considering an alternative study corridor. I feel the community should be adequately consulted regarding these developments through public hearings and through the NEB process.

10+11+12) I live about 100 m away from the existing pipeline (although details as to where the new pipeline will be placed are still rather vague). I have a direct interest in obtaining and questioning information pertaining to the placement route of the pipeline. I would also like to assess information regarding how residents will be compensated in the case of damage, what evacuation protocols are in cases of emergency, human health risks involved etc. The safety and security of residents should be placed first and foremost, and I believe Kinder Morgan has an obligation to present clear and detailed information speaking to these matters to potentially affected residents, and that issues that local residents bring to the NEB through these hearing should also be taken into account. Furthermore, we as residents may need clarification, to question existing frameworks, and to provide input into potential solution. At this stage, this may only be accomplished at this stage through the intervenor process.
