

I reside part-time on Lasqueti Island. Some of what I eat comes from what I harvest from the sea and the seashore — prawns, seaweeds, salmon, oysters, clams etc. I shop at the beach when the tide drops, as well as year-round for the ocean's abundance of fish and I know a lot of others on the Island who commonly harvest from the ocean too. I've looked at KM's computer-generated Salish Sea spill study - of a relatively small spill which shows dilbit fouling to north of Texada Island and surrounding Lasqueti. I'm concerned for the risk factor presented by the sevenfold increase in tanker traffic and the increased risk this presents. Even though the risk is small, putting my valued food source at risk is unacceptable.

Lasqueti isn't connected to the BC Hydro grid. We make our own power here. Some people run generators but most rely heavily on renewable power sources. In this context, it's obvious we don't need this project. We need to keep this tarry muck coming out of the ground slowly, if at all, and be spending more of our money and energy instead on conservation and increased renewable power generation. The main outcome of this project is China gets a cheap source of energy so they can keep making cheap goods to sell to consumers in Canada and the world over. Canada has very little to gain from this exchange.

As for contingency planning for spills and so on, I have very little confidence that adequate measures will be in place for when an accident happens.

I love our clean and beautiful coastlines and it's so clear to me that these things are a higher priority than allowing for the last-ditch efforts of the fossil fools.
