5	THE CHAIRMAN: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen.
6 7	Bonjour, mesdames and messieurs.
8	My name is Elizabeth Quarshie and I am the Chair of the Joint
9	Review Panel established by the Minister of the Environment and the National
10	Energy Board to consider the pipeline application for Georgia Strait Crossing
11 12	Pipeline Limited.
12	The other two members of the Joint Panel are Mr. Rowland
14	Harrison to my right and the Honourable Bryan Williams to my left.
15	
16	On April 24th, 2001, Georgia Strait Crossing Pipeline Limited, or
17	the Applicant, applied, pursuant to Part III and Part IV of the National Energy
18	<i>Board Act</i> , for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity and for related
19	orders for a 60-kilometre pipeline, 406-millimetre outside diameter, connecting at
20	a point at the Canada-U.S. border in Boundary Pass east of Saturna Island to a
21	connection with the Centra Gas B.C. Pipeline Inc. at the west point of Shawnigan
22	Lake on Vancouver Island.
23	
24	Prior to the filing of the application under the National Energy
25	Board Act, the National Energy Board referred the GSX Canada Pipeline Project
26	to the Minister of the Environment for referral to a Review Panel under the
27	Canadian Environmental Assessment Act.
28	
29	On the 4th of October 2000, the Minister announced a referral of
30	the project to a Review Panel, and by an agreement dated 15th August 2001, the
31	Board and the Minister of the Environment agreed to establish a Joint Review
32	Panel with a mandate under the National Energy Board Act and the Canadian
33	Environment Assessment Act.
34	
35	Under the Canadian Environmental Assessment Act, this Panel is
36	to make recommendations concerning environmental assessment matters related
37	to the proposed pipeline. Under the National Energy Board Act, this Panel must
38	make a decision as to whether or not the proposed pipeline is in the public
39	convenience and necessity.

In order to make its recommendations and decision, the Panel will
consider the evidence filed by the Applicant, intervenors and other parties during
the public hearing process.

The Panel intends to examine the issues set out in the Revised List of Issues which was released with the ruling from the Panel dated 31 May 2001. The Panel would ask that participants in this proceeding bear in mind the List of Issues which was determined following public consultation sessions last year.

As well, as parties are aware, there have been numerous rulings by
 the Panel on pre-hearing motions. Some of those rulings specifically address
 questions regarding the scope of matters that are relevant to this proceeding.

Parties are asked to be mindful of these previous decisions of the
Panel when they cross-examine other parties, offer their own oral evidence and
make their submissions.

57 The Panel plans to sit each day from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and 58 from 2:00 p.m. till 4:00 p.m. In addition, the Panel will sit tomorrow evening at 59 7:00 p.m. in order to hear from parties who only wish to make oral comments to 60 the Panel. If it appears that additional time is needed in order to complete the 61 hearing on time, the Panel may reconsider these sitting times at a later date.

The Panel is concerned that hearing time be used efficiently and effectively. There has been a great deal of evidence exchanged prior to the commencement of this oral hearing. There has also been a Marine Technical Conference. These pre-hearing activities were designed to make all of the parties aware of the evidence in advance of the hearing and make the oral hearing more efficient. The purpose of cross-examination at the oral hearing is to test the pre-filed evidence of the Applicant and the parties.

70 The Panel calls upon parties to direct their cross-examination to those portions of the evidence that are relevant to the issues in this hearing, that 71 are in dispute and are of consequence. The Panel will not allow "sweetheart" 72 73 cross-examinations, which is a cross-examination of a witness by a party who is 74 not adverse in interest to the witness. Parties should not use cross-examination to 75 enter their own evidence or argument. The Panel also asks that parties avoid repeating cross-examination in areas that have already been canvassed by another 76 party in cross-examination and responded to by the Applicant or another party. 77 78 Parties are encouraged to talk to other intervenors and review transcripts in order 79 to make sure that their areas of questioning have not already been appropriately responded to by a witness. 80

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82	If any party has a special need with respect to the timing of their
83	appearance or cross-examination, the Panel asks that they first try to make
84	arrangements with other parties and Panel Counsel before bringing the matter to
85	the attention of the Panel. It is very important to make prior arrangements
86	because if you are not present when called upon at any point in this hearing, you
87	will lose the opportunity to speak on that matter or cross-examine that particular
88	witness panel unless you have made alternative arrangements through counsel.
89	The Panel will try to accommodate parties' schedules to a reasonable extent but
90	must also consider the need for fairness to all parties, timing constraints and the

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91 efficient running of the hearing.

4010	I would like to cross-examine panels 1, 4 and 5, and with your
4011	permission, after hearing various submissions, I wondered if it would be possible
4012	to reserve the right to cross-examine other panels. And I do
4013	
4014	THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Campbell, do you mean other
4015	intervenors' panels or the Applicant's panels?
4016	
4017	MR. CAMPBELL: Both if possible.
4018	
4019	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay.
4020	
4021	MR. CAMPBELL: And I do intend to provide final argument.
4022	
4023	I want to thank the Panel for having the pre-hearing conference
4024	yesterday. It was very interesting and there were some items that were brought
4025	up, some suggestions, some concerns that some of the intervenors like myself had,
4026	and that was to do with the fact that I have submitted to the Panel eleven various
4027	written documents that are on the exhibit list and my concern is that it doesn't
4028	seem as though those are going to be recognized as evidence. This is where my
4029	concern is. It is that I don't think that I am allowed to ask the Applicant's panel
4030	witnesses questions that would arise from my exhibits and we just didn't seem to
4031	be able to resolve that yesterday.
4032	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, were these pre-filed?
4033	
4034	MR. CAMPBELL: Yes, they're all pre-filed.
4035	
4036	THE CHAIRMAN: Well if they are pre-filed, then we don't see
4037	any problem. You should be able to cross-examine on them.
4038	
4039	MR. CAMPBELL: Okay. Well, the consensus seemed to be
4040	yesterday that we thought that we could not ask questions of the witnesses arising
4041	from the exhibits.
4042	
4043	MS HANEBURY: Perhaps, Madam Chair, I would suggest that
4044	Mr. Campbell speak to one of the counsel. I will be introducing them at the end

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4045	of the order of appearances and we can perhaps provide some assistance to him in
4046	this matter.
4047	
4048	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Ms Hanebury.
4049	
4050	Maybe one more question. Do you want to be moved down in the
4051	order of appearances or is this okay with you?
4052	
4053	MR. CAMPBELL: Perhaps it would be best if the legal counsel
4054	were ahead of me. So it wouldn't matter to me.

4088	that this was quite relevant in that there is going to be some additional charges
4089	charged apparently to BC Hydro, which would impact on the generation of
4090	electricity, using natural gas here on the Island. And I wondered if that was
4091	something that I could also discuss with counsel to see if I could bring this
4092	forward?
4093	
4094	I did talk to Rob Pellet, who is a secretary at BCUC, this morning
4095	and apparently the Panel will be resuming on the 3rd of March and he anticipates
4096	it will be finished by the 6th of March, and I thought that that information perhaps
4097	would be relevant to this Panel as well.
4098	
4099	THE CHAIRMAN: I have to admit that off the top of my head I
4100	am having trouble seeing how the rate increase could have an impact relative to
4101	this hearing, but certainly I would also suggest that Panel Counsel can look at the
4102	material and then we will see if there's any objections to it.

4118	THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Campbell?
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4119 4120 4121	MR. CAMPBELL: Could you just excuse me for one minute? I am sure that Marie Christofferson wanted to appear and could we ask for a conditional request?
4122	THE CHAIRMAN: By all means.
4123	MR. CAMPBELL: Thank you.
4124	MS HANEBURY: Cowichan Tribes.
4125	No response/Pas de réponse
4126	MR. ANDREWS: I am not here for the Cowichan Tribes.
4127 4128	My name is William Andrews. I am speaking to the Consumers Association of Canada intervenor, if I may assist the panel.
4129 4130 4131 4132	I understand CAC has counsel, and roughly speaking, their intention is certainly to file final argument. I don't have specific instructions to enter an appearance on their behalf but perhaps it could be recorded as a conditional appearance.
4133	MS HANEBURY: Thank you.
4134 4135	THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Andrews, is this something on behalf of Mr. Doherty?
4136	MR. ANDREWS: That's correct.
4137 4138	THE CHAIRMAN: You don't have any idea whether he wishes to file additional evidence or any of those other questions that I asked earlier?
4139	MR. ANDREWS: No, I have no answers to those questions.
4140	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.
4141 4142	MS HANEBURY: Department of Justice on behalf of several federal government departments.
4143 4144	MR. CLARK: Thank you, Madam Chair. My name is John Clark. I am from the Department of Justice and I am representing the three

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4145 remaining federal intervenors: Parks Canada, Fisheries and Oceans Canada, and4146 Environment Canada.

With respect to your questions, the federal intervenors do plan to
present evidence and witnesses and I will seek leave to file further evidence. We
will not be making a statement to the Panel. We don't presently intend to
cross-examine the Applicant but we would like to reserve that right if we might.
Again, we don't presently intend to make final argument, but again I would like to
reserve that right if I might.

There is that. Two additional matters, Madam Chair. Three of the federal intervenors, Parks Canada -- sorry -- Fisheries and Oceans Canada, Environment Canada and NRCan have additional updates with respect to their evidence. The reason that the material was not filed earlier was that it relates to matters that have taken place since they filed their original evidence. So I would like to seek your leave to file that today if I might.

4159 And finally, with respect to the availability of the federal witnesses, I believe we have got 19 federal witnesses and I would ask that if it's 4160 convenient for the Joint Panel, you might consider scheduling the federal 4161 intervenors for the week of -- I think it's the third week -- March 10th to 14th. We 4162 of course will do our best to accommodate and bring all our witnesses for 4163 whenever they arise, but we have a number of witnesses and it appeared most 4164 logical they would probably appear that week. We have asked them all to ensure 4165 that that week is free in their schedules, so we believe we can bring all 19 4166 witnesses that week. 4167

4168 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clark, we will do our best to coordinate 4169 that schedule. I can't make any promises. 4170 Do you wish to cross-examine other intervenors' witness panels? 4171 MR. CLARK: Again, that is not our current plan but if I might I would like to reserve that right. And we will do everything we can to 4172 accommodate your schedule. 4173 4174 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you. 4175 MR. CLARK: Thank you.

4176 **MS HANEBURY:** Ms Joanna Dudley.

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4177	MS DUDLEY: Good morning. My name is Joanna Dudley.
4178 4179	THE CHAIRMAN: I am sorry, could you speak into the microphone?
4180	MS DUDLEY: I am sorry, I didn't notice it.
4181 4182 4183 4184 4185 4186	My name is Joanna Dudley. I registered as an intervenor prior to the informal panel hearing at Arbutus Ridge on the 14th of January last year. My regular address in Cowichan Station close to Koksilah Road is approximately one kilometre as the crow flies from the chosen route of the proposed pipeline crossing and I feel that I would be directly affected as a result, which is why I am here.
4187 4188 4189 4190 4191 4192 4193	Until later this year, for the purposes of study, my temporary address is in Vancouver and as I just cannot be here tomorrow evening as well as today, I would respectfully request the Panel's permission to allow my oral statement to be read on my behalf tomorrow evening by a fellow intervenor, Mr. Jolyon Briggs, who is also a neighbour of mine. This will be less than ten minutes in length. I don't have evidence or arguments but I would like to have an opportunity to make a statement and I can't come back tomorrow evening.
4194 4195	THE CHAIRMAN: That will be fine, Mrs. Dudley. We will accept Mr. Briggs to read your statement on your behalf.
4196	MS DUDLEY: Thank you very much. Thank you.
4197	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.
4198	MS HANEBURY: Duke Energy Trading & Marketing L.L.C.
4199	No response/Pas de réponse
4200 4201	MS HANEBURY: Mr. Richard Dwyer has asked that we register a conditional appearance on his behalf.
4202	Mr. Anthony D. Fisher.
4203 4204 4205	MR. FISHER: My name is Anthony D. Fisher. I live in Cobble Hill right off Aros Road, where the pipeline one of the alternative pipeline routes is scheduled to be.

4206 THE CHAIRMAN: Do you wish to give oral comments, and if so, would you prefer to do that tomorrow evening or make another arrangement 4207 through Panel Counsel? 4208 4209 **MR. FISHER:** I didn't attach it 4229 **THE CHAIRMAN:** All right, I understand. Perhaps you can pass 4230 that over to Counsel as well. 4231 MR. FISHER: Okay. 4232 THE CHAIRMAN: Do you plan to cross-examine the 4233 Applicant's witness panels? 4234 **MR. FISHER:** Yes and no. Because I just got the information on how the Applicant's witness panels were organized at the back of the room here, 4235 Order GH-4-2001

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4236 and as the witness panels don't actually match up at all with the List of Issues that 4237 the Panel agreed on, I think I would like to ask questions of all the panels except 4238 number 4; but I am not sure. So if you would allow me to sort of reserve on that. 4239 THE CHAIRMAN: Do you wish to cross-examine any intervenors' witness panels? 4240 4241 MR. FISHER: No. 4242 THE CHAIRMAN: Do you wish to present final argument? 4243 MR. FISHER: Yes, I do. 4244 THE CHAIRMAN: Outside of the two issues you raised this 4245 morning, do you have any other preliminary matters to raise with the Panel this morning? 4246 4247 **MR. FISHER:** Well, I am concerned about the length of time that 4248 the Panel will be sitting. I am a retired university professor and two weeks ago, I 4249 had to fly back to Edmonton for a PhD exam with one of my students who was a 4250 little slow. She has been struggling with it for over a dozen years. So I don't want to miss out on making a final argument if the time for final arguments comes 4253 4254 up at that same time. 4255 I also would like it, if possible, if the Panel could somehow through the e-mail communicate to the intervenors who don't live here on the 4256 Saanich Peninsula but live up in the Cowichan Valley what has happened on the 4257 4258 previous day and the best guess of what would happen on the next day, because it 4259 burns a lot of gas, and even in the Cowichan Valley it's 81.9 per litre, and running back and forth across the Malahat is just not the way I would like to spend the 4260 4261 next month's time 4262 **THE CHAIRMAN:** Well we will try and make it apparent each 4263 day where we are in the proceedings so people who are watching the webcast can determine where we are, for that matter. Excuse me for a moment. 4264 4265 Now regarding the schedule, if you could, if you could give us an 4266 indication, provide an indication to the Panel Counsel as to the time period that you are not available, that would absolutely not work for you, I think that would 4267 4268 help us in the planning.

4282	MS HANEBURY: Thank you.
4283	GSX Concerned Citizens' Coalition.
4284 4285 4286	MR. ANDREWS: Madam Chair, William Andrews representing the GSX Concerned Citizens' Coalition. With me is Mr. Thomson Hackney who will also be speaking for the Coalition at points.
4287 4288 4289 4290 4291 4292 4293 4294	I would like to briefly, for the record, describe the GSX Concerned Citizens' Coalition as it has grown somewhat since the original description, and I will be brief with this. There are about 80 individual members of the Coalition and its organizational members include the Sierra Club of Canada (B.C. Chapter), the Georgia Strait Alliance, the Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society (B.C. Regional Office), the Council of Canadians (Cowichan Chapter), the Council of Canadians (Victoria Chapter), Saturna Community Club, Pender Island Conservancy Association, and Shawnigan Lake Watershed Watch.
4295 4296 4297	The brief purpose of the Coalition is to ensure a fair and rigorous assessment of the GSX proposal. The Coalition intends to present evidence. I will not be making an oral opinion statement tomorrow night. I do have

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4298 4299	additional evidence to file and I have a notice of motion and copies which I could submit now if that is your preference.
4300	THE CHAIRMAN: I'm sorry, Mr. Andrews, did you say you
4301	have a motion?
4302	MR. ANDREWS: Yes, I do
4303	THE CHAIRMAN: We will consider the motions later. I am
4304	sure we will have a number of motions to entertain, so it will be good to group
4305	them all together and consider them at the same time.
4306	MR. ANDREWS: So that everyone is aware, copies of the
4307	documents which we seek to introduce are on the back table and I have provided a
4308	set of copies to the Applicant.
4309	THE CHAIRMAN: Perhaps you could just give us a flavour of
4310	what the motion is about?
4311	MR. ANDREWS: It's to introduce three documents.
4312	One is excerpts from the 2003 National Energy Board Energy
4313	Outlook Public Consultation Draft which is the follow-up document to the 1999
4314	National Energy Board Outlook which was relied upon, among other documents,
4315	by the Applicant.
4316	The second is a table produced by Mr. Rob Woronuk
4317	(W-O-R-O-N-U-K) who will be one of the Coalition's witnesses. These drafts
4318	merely use the same data as are in the NEB 2003 document, but remove from the
4319	graph sources of gas that are not relevant to the GSX pipeline such as east coast.
4320	Thirdly, we are introducing or we seek to have introduced
4321	overheads in the presentation by B.C. Hydro in January of 2003 regarding the
4322	merits of the proposal.
4323	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.
4324	MR. ANDREWS: The GSX Concerned Citizens' Coalition
4325	intends to at least consider cross-examining each of the Applicant's panels. The
4326	panel certainly of most interest will be panel number 2.

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The Coalition would like to reserve the right to cross-examine panel witnesses by intervenors, bearing in mind that sweetheart cross-examination is not permitted.
The Coalition does intend to make a final argument.
No, the Coalition does not seek to be moved down the list of appearances.
I have one preliminary matter to raise, which is that in the list of exhibits under Exhibit Number C-32-56, this is the GSX Concerned Citizens' Coalition's evidence filed on November 28, 2002, there is a list of subdocuments under that exhibit number. Document 5, document 6 and document 7 themselves attach appendices which are not listed in the exhibit list and I would ask either simply that that be noted and confirmed that the appendices are indeed included in the exhibit, or if it would be necessary for the record, I would read the appendices that ought to be listed under documents 5, 6 and 7.
THE CHAIRMAN: Are those included or do we have to provide a different exhibit list for those?
MS HANEBURY: Perhaps what we could do is just check our records and confirm that they are filed and then we will advise you after the break, Madam Chair.

4523	THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.
4524	
4525	MS HANEBURY: Could you tell us which ones, Mr. Marchant,
4526	that you think at this time you might be cross-examining?
4527	
4528	MR. MARCHANT: My interest lies in a question to Powerex
4529	and one or two questions to hydro. And when I say I reserve the right, I know that
4530	directors of the coalition have been asked not to repeat questioning. And so I sort
4531	of have to wait to see how things unfold.
4532	
4533	THE CHAIRMAN: That's fine. Do you wish to present final
4534	argument?
4535	
4536	MR. MARCHANT: Yes.
4537	
4538	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you have any preliminary matters this
4539	morning?
4540	
4541	MR. MARCHANT: No.

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4542	
4543	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you wish to be moved down in the order
4544	of appearances?
4545	
4546	MR. MARCHANT: I would prefer to come after Powerex.
4547	·
4548	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Marchant.
4549	
4550	MR. MARCHANT: Thank you.
4551	-
4552	MS HANEBURY: Ms Màiri McLennan.
4553	
4554	MRS. MILLER: Mrs. Miller again. I would like to register a
4555	conditional appearance for Ms McLennan. I believe she has discussed this with
4556	the people who were offering the session yesterday. There's a little bit of a
4557	problem. Ms McLennan is employed Monday to Friday, but she has asked Mr.
4558	Steve Miller and myself to pose certain questions and answer some of the
4559	questions on the appearance not as a conditional appearance. Like, to act on her
4560	behalf for some of these things, particularly the preliminary matters. Particularly
4561	in reference to preliminary matters which she has given us and asked us to present
4562	those today because by the time she can put in an appearance, they'll no longer be
4563	preliminary. Would you like us to address those questions now or
4564	
4565	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, please give us a flavour for it.
4566	
4567	MRS. MILLER: Is it all right if Mr. Miller takes over that part
4568	of this discussion?
4569	
4570	THE CHAIRMAN: That's perfectly fine.
4571	
4572	MRS. MILLER: Thank you.
4573	MR. MILLER: Mary has prepared a motion and I have five
4574	copies of it here. The motion contains five subsections. Each of them pertains to
4575	scheduling and if I can tell you something about them, you'll see why these
4576	particularly affect her situation because they concern the timing of these sessions.
4577	
4578	So if you would like, I can tell you the essence of these five
4579	components.
4580	
4581	THE CHAIRMAN: Please go ahead.
4582	

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4583	MR. MILLER: Màiri McLennan moves that at least one evening
4584	cross-examination session be scheduled for each of the Applicants' panel. That
4585	some sessions for final argument include Saturday or evening times, that some
4586	sessions for final argument include venues in Cobble Hill, or other regional
4587	locations. That the following days expected schedule be published each evening
4588	on the National Energy Board or Applicants' Web site, and finally that telephone
4589	and fax contact information for any of the staff in Sidney be provided to
4590	intervenors who are unable to attend daily.
4591	
4592	She has also provided some rationale for each of these but perhaps
4593	we can go over that should you hold a debate on these topics.
4594	
4595	THE CHAIRMAN: I'm sorry, Mr. Miller, I missed the last point
4596	so maybe you can repeat that again.
4597	
4598	MR. MILLER: The last one was that telephone and fax contact
4599	information for any of the staff in Sidney be provided.
4600	
4601	THE CHAIRMAN: That's perfectly fine. We'll be more than
4602	delighted to do the last one. We'll consider the other ones.
4603	
4604	Are you in a position to answer the rest of the questions on her
4605	behalf?
4606	
4607	MRS. MILLER: Tentatively, yes. I know what she would like
4608	to do. Whether it's going to prove to be possible, I'm not so sure. But I'll certainly
4609	make every effort to answer them.
4610	
4611	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you feel more comfortable deferring
4612	those until she's here?
4613	
4614	MRS. MILLER: No, I think I would like to answer the questions
4615	with the understanding that at the first appearance she's able to make, she may
4616	revise them slightly, if that's okay.
4617	
4618	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Would you have additional evidence
4619	to file?
4620	
4621	MRS. MILLER: I do not believe so.
4622	
4623	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Do you plan to cross-examine the
4624	Applicant's witness panels?

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4625	
4626	MRS. MILLER: A lot of this will depend on the Panel's
4627	response to one of the motions that Ms McLennan entered, but in the best of all
4628	possible worlds, she does have several cross-examination questions she would
4629	like to pose.
4630	1
4631	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you have any idea which of the witness
4632	panels she'll be interested in cross-examining?
4633	r
4634	MRS. MILLER: I believe that panels 1 and 2 are of primary
4635	interest, but she would like to reserve the right to question any of the others as
4636	well.
4637	
4638	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Do you plan to present final
4639	argument?
4640	arbantone.
4641	MRS. MILLER: Yes, definitely.
4642	
4643	THE CHAIRMAN: Then outside of the preliminary matters that
4644	you've raised, are there any additional matters that you wish to bring forward to
4645	the Panel?
4646	
4647	MRS. MILLER: I would just like to mention that
4648	Ms McLennan's current employment provides her what's called a flex day every
4649	second Friday. Her last flex day was this Friday past. So the next first time she
4650	could attend a daytime session would be Friday two weeks from now. March the
4651	5th, I believe it is. I'm not sure. But the last Friday in March. And then it would
4652	be two weeks following that. So assuming that the hearing would be in the final
4653	argument stage in four weeks precisely, then she would be able to easily be
4654	present on that Friday.
4655	Process on the risk.
4656	If the timing goes somewhat awry, she will need to be in contact
4657	with Panel counsel and try to make some other arrangements, unless the Panel
4658	rules favourably on some of the motions she's presented regarding alternate
4659	scheduling.
4660	
4661	THE CHAIRMAN: Would she like to be moved down in the
4662	order of appearances?
4663	
4664	MRS. MILLER: I don't think that that would be of any
4665	assistance to her, so I would say no, but she is requesting some degree of latitude
4666	in scheduling her out of the order of appearances depending on her availability.

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4667	
4668	THE CHAIRMAN: And would she like to cross-examine other
4669	intervenor witness panels?
4670	
4671	MRS. MILLER: She would like to reserve the right to do so. At
4672	the moment it's not clear which intervenors are going to be putting up witness
4673	panels, and so she finds herself unable to answer that.
4674	
4675	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs. Miller.
4676	
4677	MRS. MILLER: Thank you, very much.
4678	
4679	MS HANEBURY: Mr. Steve and Dodie Miller.
4680	
4681	MRS. MILLER: My name is Dodie Miller. I represent on the
4682	list, finally, I'm listed in the order of appearances under "S", for Shady Brook
4683	Farm, which is the name of the small mixed farm that my husband and I operate
4684	just off the intersection of Telegraph and Fisher Road, which is within one
4685	kilometer of the current pipeline route as it passes near to Aros Road.
4686	
4687	THE CHAIRMAN: Would you like to provide oral comment to
4688	the Panel and, if so or would you prefer to do that tomorrow evening or at
4689	another time?
4690	
4691	MRS. MILLER: No, thank you.
4692	
4693	THE CHAIRMAN: Would you like to file additional evidence?
4694	
4695	MRS. MILLER: At this time, yes, and I would also like to
4696	reserve the right to file additional evidence, should it become available during the
4697	course of the hearings. Like some dated information that isn't available now, but
4698	could be reasonably anticipated to be made available later.
4699	
4700	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, I think we will have to cross that
4701	bridge when we get to it. It's premature.
4702	
4703	MRS. MILLER: Okay. I'm sorry, I don't understand the process
4704	too well, so I figure it's better to ask now rather than miss the chance by not
4705	asking.
4706	
4707	THE CHAIRMAN: I understand.
4708	

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4709	MRS. MILLER: The evidence that I would like to enter right
4710	now is an article from this morning's Vancouver Sun, the business section, section
4711	"C". The article begins on page C-1 and conditions on page C-3. I did purchase
4712	one copy of the newspaper this morning in order to have the authenticity of the
4713	article available. It has been circulated over an E-mail list that we are partners to.
4714	
4715	And so I can tomorrow, if the Panel wishes, bring additional copies
4716	printed off my computer, but I didn't want to start printing them and find that it
4717	wasn't necessary or wasn't required. So I have this one page I mean the original
4718	document, and I can provide copies once the Panel is satisfied that the providence
4719	of the article is genuine.
4720	
4721	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, all right. I think we'll have to it
4722	makes it a little difficult because if there are other intervenors in here who wish to
4723	argue about that then there wouldn't be enough copies available, that makes it a
4724	little difficult.
4725	
4726	MRS. MILLER: I actually do have one additional printed out
4727	copy from the computer that I printed out for my own reference this morning.
4728	copy nom me comparer and i printed out for my own reference and morning.
4729	THE CHAIRMAN: Maybe I will just refer you to talk to Ms
4730	Hanebury about that at the break.

4753	
4754	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Do you wish to cross-examine the
4755	Applicant's witness panels?
4756	
4757	MRS. MILLER: Yes, I do. In particular, I have an interest in
4758	cross-examining panels 1, 2, 5 and 8 but I would like to reserve the right to
4759	cross-examine additional panels as they come forward.
4760	
4761	THE CHAIRMAN: Would you like to cross-examine other
4762	intervenors' panels?
4763	1
4764	MRS. MILLER: I would like to reserve the right to
4765	cross-examine intervenors' panels. At the moment I'm not sure which intervenors
4766	are actually going to be coming forward with witness panels, so I find myself
4767	unable to give you anything specific.
4768	
4769	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay.
4770	
4771	MRS. MILLER: And I understand that I am only entitled to
4772	cross-examine intervenors whose interests are
4773	
4774	THE CHAIRMAN: Adverse.
4775	
4776	MRS. MILLER: Thank you. Adverse to mine. Sorry, excuse
4777	me. You say that part.
4778	
4779	MR. MILLER: We would also like to notify you of the
4780	possibility that we would address questions to the Intervenor of the Province of
4781	B.C.
4782	
4783	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, provided it is not a "sweetheart"
4784	cross-examination, yes.
4785	
4786	MR. MILLER: That's a difficult question since we're all citizens
4787	of the province, but you will have to determine that at the time.
4788	
4789	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay.
4790	
4791	MRS. MILLER: Okay. Sorry.
4792	

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4793	THE CHAIRMAN: No problem. Do you wish to present final
4794	argument?
4795	
4796	MRS. MILLER: Yes, please.
4797	
4798	THE CHAIRMAN: Are there additional preliminary matters that
4799	you wish to raise this morning?
4800	
4801	MRS. MILLER: Yes. The first one is I'd just like to mention
4802	that at various times during cross-examination I'm hoping that I may call upon
4803	others to assist me with that cross-examination who are not listed under Shady
4804	Brook Farm as being the intervenors. In particular, I anticipate calling Mr. Kevin
4805	Maher, and others, and Maher is M-A-H-E-R. I believe he has appeared before
4806	this Panel on several other occasions previously.
4807	
4808	Another preliminary matter. I would like at this time, with your
4809	indulgence, to thank Mr. Davies for his prompt reply to a request that we sent out
4810	fairly late in the day Calgary time on Friday to provide a matching of issues with
4811	Panel numbers. It's much appreciated. Thank you so much.
4812	
4813	THE CHAIRMAN: Would you like to be moved down in the
4814	order of appearances? I see you use Shady Brook, and of course we're using your
4815	name, Mrs. Miller. Would you prefer to be in the "M" category or the "S"
4816	category?
4817	
4818	MRS. MILLER: We would prefer to be in the "Ss", please, to
4819	provide us with some guidance beforehand in how things are happening.
4820	
4821	And if I can just back up a little bit. We also have several motions
4822	that we would like to bring forward at the appropriate time. I have several copies
4823	for each member of the Panel and a few extra copies for Panel staff, which I can
4824	distribute at the correct time. Would you like me to give you the basic overview of
4825	what these motions would entail?
4826	
4827	THE CHAIRMAN: Please do.
4828	
4829	MRS. MILLER: Okay. I'm asking that each GSX PL witness
4830	panel be deferred to the beginning of a new day. That each panel would start on
4831	its own day. That the hours I have a motion regarding the hours of the hearing
4832	sessions. Specifically that they begin no earlier than 10:00 a.m.
4833	
4834	THE CHAIRMAN: Sorry, no later than 10:00 a.m.?

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4835	
4836	MRS. MILLER: No, earlier than 10:00 a.m. I have a motion
4837	relating to the JRP IR 36, and regarding scheduling of adequate time for
4838	intervenors to review the responses to that IR.
4839	•
4840	I have a motion that the Applicant's panel number 1 not be called
4841	prior to Wednesday, February 26th at the earliest.
4842	
4843	I am also having a motion that any intervenor who has
4844	inadvertently not appeared when called to register today, this morning, be afforded
4845	an opportunity to do so at the end of the registration hearings the registration
4846	proceedings, I'm sorry. So if someone got held up in traffic, for example, that we
4847	cut them a bit of slack.
4848	
4849	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, I think, as we indicated in the opening
4850	statement, if prior arrangements are made then we will make phone numbers
4851	available, or if a person phones, we can try to accommodate that. But if those
4852	things are not done and you miss a witness panel, we would have a hard time
4853	recalling the witness panel just for that session. That makes it very difficult.
4854	
4855	MRS. MILLER: I'm sorry. We're not quite on the same page
4856	here.
4857	
4858	THE CHAIRMAN: Oh, okay.
4859	
4860	MRS. MILLER: What I'm referring to is registering for the order
4861	of appearances.
4862	
4863	THE CHAIRMAN: Oh, okay.
4864	
4865	MRS. MILLER: That if someone got held up in traffic and they
4866	were a "C" and we're now at the "Ms" or "Ss", or whatever we're at, that they be
4867	permitted, if they arrive late today, to register, even though they didn't have a
4868	conditional or didn't respond when their name was called.
4869	
4870	THE CHAIRMAN: I understand. Thank you for the
4871	clarification.
4872	
4873	MRS. MILLER: And as well, and I'm not sure I'm not sure
4874	where this would come into the proceedings. I do have some comments I would
4875	like to make on not comments. Express some concerns that a number of
4876	intervenors have shared regarding public access to this hearing process to date.

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4877	
4878	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, maybe we could consider it as a
4879	motion. Since you're on the motions, we might as well keep going.
4880	
4881	MRS. MILLER: Okay. So I should present that as a motion that
4882	the Panel accept these comments in the spirit in which because we're not
4883	particularly asking for any action.
4884	
4885	THE CHAIRMAN: Oh.
4886	
4887	MRS. MILLER: It's more to have it entered into the record some
4888	of the concerns.
4889	
4890	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. So if you don't want an action from
4891	the Panel, then it's not a motion because we don't have to rule.
4892	
4893	MRS. MILLER: That's right.
4894	
4895	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay.
4896	
4897	MRS. MILLER: What we're asking is rather than let you rule
4898	oh, I'm sorry. Apparently, I'm sorry. Apparently there is a "we ask that." So I
4899	guess that could be put in terms of a motion. I mean, it could be perceived as a
4900	motion if we're asking for something.
4901	
4902	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, do you want a ruling from the Panel
4903	or not? If you do, it has to be a motion.
4904	
4905	MRS. MILLER: Okay. It's not so much a ruling as a request. I
4906	don't think it's a motion, do you?
4907	
4908	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, okay. Why don't you start, present it
4909	and then we'll see where it goes.
4910	
4911	MRS. MILLER: Okay.
4912	
4913	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay.
4914	MDS MILLED. Where is the reference to this Stave?
4915	MRS. MILLER: Where is the reference to this, Steve?
4916	THE CHAIDMAN. I have the net a second law and the Id
4917	THE CHAIRMAN: I hope it's not a very long presentation. It's just to give us a flavour of what the motion is about
4918	just to give us a flavour of what the motion is about.

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4919	
4920	MRS. MILLER: I'm going to ask Mr. Miller to do it because I'm
4921	beginning to lose my place and I think he can do it more effectively.
4922	
4923	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay.
4924	
4925	MR. MILLER: This seems to be my only chance to be called
4926	Mr. Miller by Mrs. Miller. This comment references the agreement between the
4927	National Energy Board and CEAA, which established this Panel and calls your
4928	attention in that agreement to section 4.3.2(c), which indicates that the Panel shall
4929	conduct its review in a manner which would promote and facilitate public
4930	participation.
4931	
4932	You've already heard in some of the motions such as that from
4933	Màiri McLennan some weaknesses in the promotion of public participation that
4934	have cropped up so far. At a meeting of intervenors in Cobble Hill last week of
4935	approximately 16 at the Cobble Hill intervenors, and intervenors extending as far
4936	north as Ladysmith Nanaimo, 23 actions of this Panel over the past months that
4937	hinder public participation were listed. I probably should not read you these four
4938	pages of such actions.
4939	
4940	THE CHAIRMAN: I think you can file that, so we don't have to
4941	hear.
4942	
4943	MR. MILLER: Yes. I haven't really tried to summarize them
4944	too well, but read you one or two to give you the flavour.
4945	
4946	There is the difficulties that have been thrown up concerning the
4947	transmission of documents to the Panel and the receipt of documents by the
4948	public. There is the abandonment virtually of the system of public registries, for
4949	lack of shelf space. There's the refusal to accept filing of documents through
4950	E-mail.
4951	
4952	There is the weakness of the NEB Web site in which many times
4953	we confront placeholders rather than actual documents and the invitation to
4954	contact a library during office hours in Edmonton. There is an extreme tightening
4955	of schedules for comment and a failure to recognize that not all the public have
4956	computers, not all the public have fax machines, not all the public even live near a
4957	public fax machine.
4958	
4959	So there's a general perception that there's been a speed up in this
4960	process. There's a perception that holding it here in Sidney, which is possibly

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4961 4962	three and a half hours away from someone who might have a concern for this, for example on the panel on VIATeC, which is in Nanaimo, a very long drive to reach
4963	here, and there is a change from what the Panel did a year ago when they travelled
4964	around the region. That is severely hindering public input. This is felt very
4965	strongly by the intervenors who are not represented by counsel.
4966	
4967	And the final statement is that we are disturbed by the perception
4968	of procedural unfairness that has been created to date. We ask that the Panel
4969	undertake to pay more than lip service to the value placed on public participation
4970	in this hearing. Please take properly and fully into account that not all intervenors
4971	are able to have legal representation throughout this process and do not discount
4972	the value of their input on complex, legal or technical grounds.
4973	
4974	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Miller. I'm sure you will
4975	file that with the Panel counsel.
4976	
4977	MRS. MILLER: Are we through?
4978	
4979	THE CHAIRMAN: Are we done?
4980	
4981	MRS. MILLER: Are we finished for ourselves or do you have
4982	any other questions for us?
4983	any other questions for us:
4984	THE CHAIRMAN: I think the only other question I have is what
4985	I asked you about being moved, and you indicated you wished to be moved to the
4986	"S" category.
4987	S category.
4988	MRS. MILLER: To the "S" category.
4989	WIRS, WILLER. TO the 5 category.
4990	MS HANEBURY: Mrs. Miller, if I could clarify for our records.
4991	We have the intervention under your personal name. Are you saying it should be
4992	under the name of Shady Brook Farms?
4993	under the name of Shady Brook Farms?
4994	MRS. MILLER: I'm now confused because in the list of parties
4995	that was sent and in all the documents that have been sent to us from the National
4995	Energy Board, they've been addressed to Shady Brook Farms.
4990	Energy Board, they ve been addressed to Shady Brook Farms.
4997 4998	MS HANEBURY: That's fine. It's just an error in our records
4998	then.
4999 5000	
5000 5001	MRS. MILLER: I just assumed that you had us registered under
5001 5002	Shady Brook Farms. I don't think it really matters. If it's easier for Panel staff and
5002	Shady brook rannis. I don't unink it rearry matters. If it's easier for ranel stall and

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5003	for transcription to list us under "M", but slot us at the end, that presents no
5004	problem.
5005	
5006	MS HANEBURY: We'll call you under the "Ss" and I'll just call
5007	you as Shady Brook Farm.
5008	
5009	MRS. MILLER: Thank you very much.
5010	
5011	MS HANEBURY: Ministry of Energy and Mines, Province of
5012	British Columbia.
5013	
5014	MR. JONES: Good morning, members of the Panel. My name is
5015	Christopher Jones. I act for the Province of British Columbia in this matter.
5016	
5017	We do not wish to make an opinion statement. We do not have
5018	additional documents to file at this time, although may in aid of
5019	cross-examination.
5020	
5021	We do not intend to cross-examine the Applicant's panels. We do
5022	intend to cross-examine at this time an intervenor panel, specifically GSX CCC.
5023	That's our current plan and I will let the Panel know if that changes in any way.
5024	
5025	And we do plan on presenting final argument. I have no
5026	preliminary matters to raise with you this morning. And I have no difficulty with
5027	my placement on the list of parties. Thank you.
5028	
5029	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Jones.
5030

5161	MRS. MILLER: I'm really sorry. When we had it's Mrs.
5162	Miller again. When we had that meeting of 16 intervenors, because there were so
5163	many people, it's difficult for me to keep track of who's here and who isn't, and
5164	one name went by a little bit too quickly for me. I wonder if I can ask your
5165	indulgence. Mr. John Parker was at the meeting last Thursday. I am not certain if
5166	he is wishing to participate in any way further. I would like to, with your
5167	permission, enter a conditional appearance for him. I will telephone him this

5191	To go through your questions seriatum, we do not wish to give an
5192	opinion statement to the Panel. Do not have additional documents to file. Plan to
5193	examine cross-examine the Applicant's witness panels 2, 3 and 5. Will wish to
5194	present final argument. Do have a preliminary matter to raise with the Panel this
5195	morning and having said all that, my name is Ian Smyth (S-M-Y-T-H) and I
5196	appear for the Saturna Community Club.
5197	
5198	Let me address the issue of preliminary matters to raise with the
5199	Panel, if I may, for a moment. The hours that you have selected for a business are
5200	9:30 to 12:30 and 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. as I understand it.
5201	-
5202	In order for a person from Saturna Island to be present for those
5203	hours, we would have to get up at 4:45 a.m. and we would get home at 10:00
5204	p.m. at night. Those are the vicissitudes of travel for those who live in what are
5205	called the outer Gulf Islands.

5207	It would greatly inconvenience us, since we don't have the option
5208	of driving, we are the prisoners of the BC ferry system and they raise the
5209	drawbridge or lower it when and if the ferries come and go.

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5210 5211 5212 5213 5214 5215 5216 5217	It would convenience us if we were able to meet between 9:00 and 12:00 and 1:00 and 3:00 and notwithstanding the fact that that might inconvenience some other people slightly, perhaps you could vary the hours from day-to-day, I'm not entirely sure, but in any event it would suit us a lot better if those five hours that you sit during the day were 9:00 to 12:00 and 1:00 to 3:00. The remaining point that I wish to make is with respect to being
5218 5219 5220 5221 5222	moved on the order of appearances. I have reason to believe that the person who will appear next will tell you that the title of the organization is the Marine Coalition and not the Saturna Marine Coalition. So we would like to be present with the Marine Coalition or during the same time on your list, if that's acceptable.
5223 5224 5225 5226 5227	THE CHAIRMAN: You've raised a tricky point with respect to the hours and I'm not quite sure what to make of it, because the evening hours don't seem to be suitable for you as well I would imagine.
5228 5229 5230 5231	MR. SMYTH: Well, if you finish after 3:00, our next ferry leaves around 7:00 and gets home about 9:45. If you start before 1 p.m., we get up to catch a ferry which leaves Saturna at 6:30 a.m.
5232 5233 5234 5235 5236	MR. WILLIAMS: Mr. Smyth, I'm just wondering with respect to the other islands, in case we found that somebody else wanted to start at 8:00 and someone else wanted to start at 12:00, does the Saturna ferry stop at Pender or anywhere else, or is that just Saturna?
5237 5238 5239	MR. SMYTH: We change at Mayne and stop at Pender. That's the 6:30 a.m.
5240 5241 5242 5243	MR. WILLIAMS: So in other words, people from Pender and Mayne might also be happy to side with your idea of 9:00 to 12:00 and 1:00 to 3:00. Is that correct?
5244 5245 5246 5247 5248 5249 5250 5251	MR. SMYTH: Well, I think that the ferry service from those places to Swartz Bay is rather more frequent than it is from Saturna. We have one choice in the morning. I think they have a couple more each. But it might be prudent for someone on staff to have a quick look through the BC ferry schedule sorry, to have a look through the BC ferry schedule to see whether in point of fact those logistics are feasible. My guess is that there isn't a computer big enough to deal with all the permeations and combinations.

5277	appearance of the next person.
5278	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Thank you.
0210	
5279	MS HANEBURY: I say with some hesitation, the Saturna Marine
5280	Coalition?
5001	
5281	MS WASHINGTON SMYTH: I can understand the confusion,
5282	Ms Hanebury.
5283	Madam Chairman, Mr. Williams and Mr. Harrison, welcome. My
5284	name is Susie Washington Smyth. I am the coordinator of The Marine Coalition
5285	and I will get to that in a moment. Before we do that, we have The Marine
5286	Coalition that is, have been concerned about acoustics, and not surprisingly we
5287	have a concern with the acoustics in this room. I think part of the problem is that
5288	as people are standing and speaking towards you, it's great for you, it's the pits for
5289	those of us who are sitting in the back of the room. And I just think it's the
5290	manner. So perhaps for the future, we could have another place where people

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who are making a presentation could speak both to you and to the audience so that
we can hear more of what is being said. It's easier with men, it's much harder with
women.

5294 There is a name change and it is The Marine Coalition as opposed 5295 to the Saturna Marine Coalition. The Marine Coalition represents the Saturna 5296 Community Club, the Pender Island Conservancy, the Saltspring Island 5297 Conservancy, the Saanich Inlet Protection Society, the Georgia Strait Alliance and 5298 Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society (British Columbia Chapter).

5299 For the purposes of the intervention with respect to 5300 cross-examination and final argument, the Gulf Crab Fishers Association has 5301 requested to participate with The Marine Coalition, both in cross-examining and 5302 in making final argument.

5303 With respect to the questions, we do not wish to give an opinion statement to the Panel. We do not at this time have any additional documents to 5304 5305 file. We do plan to cross-examine the Applicant's witness panels, specifically panel 5 and panel 7. I believe I filed a letter on February 19th with respect to 5306 these matters. There is a copy -- in case you guys didn't get a copy there is a copy 5307 in the back room and I know that legal counsel has access to that -- and in that we 5308 outline the witnesses that we are both -- that will be available for 5309 5310 cross-examination and also those individuals who will be cross-examining the 5311 Applicant.

5312 Do we plan to cross-examine any intervenors? I would like to say 5313 possibly. It is a federal intervenor and we have one question and if perhaps Mr. 5314 Clark, who I could not see because my eyes are so bad at the moment, could come 5315 and find me at the back of the room we may be able to resolve that one question.

5316 Yes, we do plan to present final argument and in terms of the order
5317 of appearance, I have two requests with respect to that. The first is that we are,
5318 our name change will automatically put us after the Society for Promoting
5319 Environmental Conservation and the David Suzuki Foundation and we would
5320 like to be placed there or after the First Nations and before UBC and that the
5321 Saturna Community Club also be put at the same place.

5322 Mr. Davies has kindly agreed to the suggestion that the Applicant 5323 cross-examine The Marine Coalition and the Gulf Crab Fishers immediately 5324 following panel 5. That is a change to the sort of procedure, but Mr. Davies has 5325 agreed, and that's because we are bringing in experts from various parts of the

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5326 5327	Pacific Northwest and it would be very helpful to do that and we have requested, in our February 19th letter, leave of the Panel to allow that to happen.
5328 5329	Just one further comment with respect to preliminary matters. Perhaps the Panel could be a little creative. Those of us from The Marine
5330	Coalition have two panels, panel 5 and panel 7, and I believe the Saturna
5331	Community Club had a couple of others. Perhaps the times could change to allow
5332	for individuals from Saturna to go back and forth without having to get up at 4:45
5333	and get home at 10:00 P.M., and move from the proposal from, that Ian made with
5334	respect to 9:00 to 12:00, 1:00 to 3:00 to enable some movement back and forth
5335	for those of us in the Gulf Islands.
5336 5337	I also have a question to ask, because I wasn't quite certain again, I can deal with Mr. Clark after.
5338	That's all, unless you have any further questions to ask me.
5339	MR. WILLIAMS: Ms Smyth, you mentioned and I didn't have
5340	a chance to write them all down the groups that you represent. Would you mind
5341	providing us with a list of that?
5342	MS WASHINGTON SMYTH: Yes, you have a list. You do.
5343	Every letter I have written has
5344	MR. WILLIAMS: Has all the names on it?
5345	MS WASHINGTON SMYTH: On the top.
5346	MR. WILLIAMS: Okay.
5347	MS WASHINGTON SMYTH: I can understand that the Panel is
5348	confused because we were asked by the secretary for the Panel at the beginning of
5349	this process, or two years ago, to clarify why The Marine Coalition was different
5350	from the GSX Citizens' Coalition and why there was the interrelationship. So let
5351	me once again clarify this for you and for the audience.
5352	The Marine Coalition and I have mentioned the groups, Saturna
5353	Community Club, Pender Island Conservancy, Saltspring Island Conservancy,
5354	Saanich Inlet Protection Society, Georgia Strait Alliance and CPWS (B.C.), are
5355	dealing with just the marine portion of the Environmental Impact Assessment.
5356	With respect to the other issues that the GSX Citizens' Coalition have queries
5357	about, we are having them represent our interests.

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5358 5359	MR. WILLIAMS: Where I am confused is I notice that CPWS is also represented by the Coalition as well as yourselves.
5360	MS WASHINGTON SMYTH: That's correct.
5361	MR. WILLIAMS: And that's because they are different issues?
5362	MS WASHINGTON SMYTH: That's right.
5363 5364	MR. WILLIAMS: As long as I get the list from both of you, I will be happy.
5365 5366	MS WASHINGTON SMYTH: I will provide that. Any further questions?
5367	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs. Smyth.
5368	MS HANEBURY: Sencot'en Alliance.
5369 5370	MS GAERTNER: Madam Chair, chairpersons, Brenda Gaertner, G-A-E-R-T-N-E-R, for the Sencot'en Alliance.
5371 5372 5373 5374 5375 5376	With respect to the questions that you have posed, we are intending to cross-examine the Applicant and cross-examine some of the intervenors. At this point we don't have any additional evidence. It's quite likely if we need to with respect to the consultation issue I will be submitting a notice of motion seeking leave to file further evidence bringing the Panel up-to-date with the events that have occurred since we filed our previous information.
5377 5378 5379 5380 5381	We intend to make final argument. We do have one preliminary matter, the notice of motion, that was filed earlier and it is before you. And with respect to the order we would like to follow, with respect to all of the panels except panel 8, we would like to follow the Society Promoting Environmental Conservation and the David Suzuki Foundation.
5382 5383	THE CHAIRMAN: Ms Gaertner, can you give us an idea, which of the panels you would like to cross-examine, if possible?
5384	MS GAERTNER: Panel 2, 3, 4, 5, we reserve on 6 and 7 and 8.
5385	THE CHAIRMAN: And the intervenor's panels?

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5386 **MS GAERTNER:** The Province of British Columbia. We may have some questions of the federal government's panel. 5387 5388 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you very much. 5389 **MS GAERTNER:** I expect you will want to hear from me on the preliminary matter. You may have gotten the letter that was sent to the Panel on 5390 Friday with regard to my notice of motion, and I was expecting to at least give you 5391 some preliminary comments with respect to that this morning. I am assuming that 5392 you want to deal with that through the Notice of Motion or I can deal with that 5393 now? 5394 5395 **MS HANEBURY:** We just received the letter this morning, Mrs. 5396 Gaertner. My understanding is that perhaps you are not going to be speaking to 5397 your motion today. If that's correct maybe you can address your comments now. If you are going to speak to your motion, the merits of it, then we will just deal 5398 with I guess in the normal course of the motions. 5399 5400 **MS GAERTNER:** I am not intending to speak to the merits of the 5401 motion today. I am expecting that at the earliest I want to bring it back to the Panel Wednesday afternoon or Thursday morning. There are a lot of last minute 5402 efforts being made by the proponent and the Crown. As late as Thursday of last 5403 week we received a letter from the provincial Crown. We need to take these into 5404 consideration and consider what our position is with respect to those what will be. 5405 5406 It's very difficult, as we have always said, for the Sencot'en to 5407 participate in both a Panel of this magnitude and complexity and try to address the 5408 consultation issues with both the proponent and the Crown. And so it's our wish 5409 to see whether or not the efforts that have been made at the last minute by both the 5410 proponent and the Crown will serve our purposes or not. If they will, then we will advise the Panel. If they will not, we will be back before the Panel. 5411 5412 **THE CHAIRMAN:** Please proceed with your preliminary indications then. Or is that what you have just indicated to us. Okay. 5413 5414 **MS GAERTNER:** I think that lets you know what we are intending to do. I hope there are no questions with respect to that. 5415 5416 **MR. WILLIAMS:** Ms Gaertner, I take it if I can put it this way, the consultation is taking place now? 5417

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5418 5419 5420 5421 5422 5423 5424 5425 5426	MS GAERTNER: To be fair, the comments that have been made by both the provincial and the federal Crown throughout this hearing have been that the consultation process is an iterative process. I have heard that a number of times. And the Sencot'en have been cleared that they don't have the resources to participate both before the Panel and in a consultation process. So what has occurred as late as last week is that we have received a letter from the provincial Crown which on its face acknowledges that there hasn't been consultation with the provincial Crown, but they wish to engage in one now. So we need to know what that means. We need to have some discussions with the provincial Crown as to
5427	what their intentions behind that letter are.
5428 5429	MR. WILLIAMS: So do I take it you will be talking with them between now and Wednesday?
5430	MS GAERTNER: Exactly.
5431 5432	MR. WILLIAMS: And then you will let us know Wednesday where that all stands?
5433	MS GAERTNER: That's right.
5434	MR. WILLIAMS: That's good. Thanks.
5435	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Ms Gaertner.
5436	MS HANEBURY: Mr. George G.P. Shephard.
5437 5438 5439 5440 5441 5442	MRS. MILLER: Mrs. Miller yet again. Mr. Shephard was also present at the meeting of Cowichan Valley and other outlying area on the island intervenors on Thursday last. I believe that he indicated that he was planning on some level of participation. I do not recall what it was. I would like to enter a conditional appearance on his behalf. I will undertake to telephone his this evening and report back tomorrow to Panel Counsel and advise of his wishes.
5443	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs. Miller.
5444	MRS. MILLER: Thank you.
5445	MS HANEBURY: Mr. Don Skerik.
5446 5447	MR. SKERIK: My name is Don Skerik. I am from Duncan, British Columbia.

- 5448**THE CHAIRMAN:** I'm sorry, we can't hear you. Can you try to5449speak closer to the microphone?
- 5450 MR. SKERIK: My name is Don Skerik and I am from Duncan,
 5451 British Columbia. With respect to the questions, number 1, I certainly would like
 5452 to give you an opinion, but you probably won't let me give an opinion and have
 5453 final argument. So I am choosing final arguments.
- I don't have any additional documents to file. I request to reserve
 the right to cross-examine the Applicant's witness panels. I don't intend to but I
 want to have the right to in case something comes up. And the same with
 intervenors. Again, I am not sure what is going to go on with other intervenors. I
 do plan on filing final argument.
- 5459 Preliminary matters. I, like a lot of other individual intervenors, have a life outside of this room here today and I work and do other things with my 5460 life, but I find the schedule is just so. There is no sort of set pattern to the 5461 schedule. We don't know when we have to be here and all that sort of stuff. So I 5462 would like to see some sort of structure on what days, what is going to happen on 5463 5464 what day. So it makes it easier for me to decide what day I have to be here. I would like to see some meetings on a Saturday. Like for when my turn comes to 5465 5466 make final argument, if my day happens to be a day I am working, how do I make 5467 my final argument? So maybe the best thing is to try to set some Saturdays up for something like that. It is a suggestion on preliminary matters. 5468
- 5469 The other preliminary matter I would like to address is in the 5470 revised List of Issues. It still states on there that there is a broad thing that says 5471 "alternatives to the project." I, in my mind, am still not convinced or not decided 5472 what that alternatives to the project means. I know there has been some talk about 5473 only alternatives, but I would like you to clarify that for me, exactly what you 5474 mean by "alternatives to the project.".
- 5475 Whether I would want to be moved down any further, I am pretty 5476 close to the bottom as it is. I don't mind if lawyers go in front of me. I would 5477 really like to fit in Saturdays and that sort of stuff. So whatever works out for you 5478 to fit me in, that fits my needs also.
- 5479 THE CHAIRMAN: Do you have any indication at this time
 5480 which of the panels you would like to cross-examine, both for the Applicant and
 5481 the intervenors?
- 5482 MR. SKERIK: I think 2 and 5, I believe.

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5483	THE CHAIRMAN: And the intervenors?
5484	MR. SKERIK: Probably the Province of B.C. possibly.
5485	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Skerik.
5486	MS HANEBURY: Snuneymuxw First Nation?
5487	No response/Pas de réponse
5488 5489	MS HANEBURY: Society Promoting Environmental Conservation and the David Suzuki Foundation?
5490 5491 5492 5493 5494 5495 5496 5497	TIM HOWARD: Tim Howard appearing on behalf of SPEC and the David Suzuki Foundation. It is our intention to participate in this hearing by cross-examination of the proponent's panels in particular. I have an interest in panels 1 through 5 at present and subject to discussion with Mr. Davies to try to focus on which of the panels are most relevant to my clients I suspect that I will have a particular interest in panels 2, 3, 4 and 5. We also intend to examine the federal intervenor panels and I say
5498 5499 5500 5501	this is all subject to my further review of the materials that are filed. I have reviewed the other intervenors' written evidence and I do not at present see anything in it that would engage my client's interest, but I will see how things unfold.
5502 5503 5504 5505 5506 5507 5508 5509 5510 5511 5512 5513	With respect to additional matters, preliminary matters or additional documents, I will be seeking leave to file updated evidence of Dan Hrebenyk, who is the consultant retained to provide a critique of the air quality modelling done for the Duke Point power plant. Mr. Hrebenyk's evidence essentially narrows the issues between the parties. Since the date of the filing of his evidence there have been considerable exchange of views and materials between Mr. Hrebenyk and the proponent's consultant and Mr. Hrebenyk's revised evidence reflects the results of that exchange. I have raised this with Mr. Davies previously and he advises me that subject to examining Mr. Hrebenyk's revised evidence to determine whether he wishes to have his expert address anything arising, he has no objection to my filing and I will bring those materials to Ms Hanebury during the break.
5514 5515	I do intend to present final argument, both written and oral. I believe I have captured the issues arising from your list.

This Centre is a non-profit association representing all the advanced technologies companies on the island, of which there are about 500, and that represents about 10,000 technology workers.
5533 5534 5535 5536 5537	I would like to give an opinion statement to the Panel and if that's possible early tomorrow evening would be good or at any other time that the Panel requires, providing you let me know in advance. Because of the nature of my work I can not attend all of the sessions, but if there was a need to attend a session and be questioned, I am quite prepared to make those arrangements.
5538	The answers to questions 2 to 7 are no.
5539	THE CHAIRMAN: I am sorry, we didn't catch your name.
5540	MR. LENNOX: Colin (C-O-L-I-N) Lennox (L-E-N-N-O-X).
5541	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Lennox.
5542 5543	MS HANEBURY: I have been asked to enter a conditional appearance on behalf of the Vancouver Island Pipeline Landowners Association.
5544	MS HANEBURY: Vassilopoulos & Williamson LC.

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5545 5546 5547 5548	MR. VASSILOPOULOS: Madam Chair, thank you for allowing us to appear before you to day. I am Spiro Vassilopoulos of the firm of Vassilopoulos & Williamson of Midland, Texas. I would like to answer these questions here.
5549 5550 5551	On whether we would like to provide an opinion statement, the answer is yes, for 15 or 30 minutes tomorrow evening or at any time it would be convenient to you.
5552 5553	Do we have additional documents to file? The answer is no but we would like to reserve that right.
5554 5555 5556	Do we plan to cross-examine the Applicant's witness panels? The answer is yes, we would like to cross-examine the panel that treasurer Valerie Lambert is on I believe it is panel 1 and reserve on the remainder.
5557 5558	Do we plan to cross-examine any intervenors? The answer is no but we would like to reserve that right.
5559 5560	Final argument, the answer is no, but we would like to reserve that right.
5561	Do I have any preliminary matters this morning? The answer is no.
5562 5563	MS HANEBURY: Mr. Vassilopoulos, just so I have the listing correct, could you tell us who your clients are or are you here on your own behalf?
5564 5565	MR. VASSILOPOULOS: We are here on our own behalf. We are the principals.
5566 5567 5568	THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Vassilopoulos, I beg your pardon if I am not pronouncing this appropriately, but you did indicate that you wished to provide an opinion statement.

5998	at the time when this issue first came out a few weeks ago, or months ago now, I

6005	Now one of the things that is a mystery is what from these
6006	people writing in and saying, "Well, what are they going to do?" And the

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problem I have as a member of this Panel, and I only speak for myself here, I don't
speak for the Panel; the problem that I have is we are going ahead with these
hearings with respect to the issue of purpose and need of this pipeline when we

6011We did send out a letter, an IR, and we got a response back from6012the Applicant, Proponent, we got a response back from them, but to me that wasn't6013complete. It doesn't tell us what Norske is doing. Are they putting up 3006014windmills? Are they going to use the gas that is brought over by this proposal?

6015Are they going to -- we don't know. And I would like to suggest to6016you that in light of that, and because we had this problem from a lot of people6017wanting to know and because of the fact that you do want to be cross-examining, I6018am hoping you at least will be prepared to put in a witness to give us some6019information.

6020 **MR. WALLACE:** I can take that back to my client. At this point their intent was not to bring a witness to this proceeding. If I can clarify, Norske 6021 6022 does have some proposals which are being discussed with Hydro that could be 6023 co-generation projects, could be demand-side management. There are a number 6024 of alternatives there. B.C. Hydro also on Vancouver Island has another, variety of other alternatives, and I think it would be our view that at this point Hydro is the 6025 6026 best party to speak to what are the various alternatives and how they fit within 6027 their needs.

6028MR. WILLIAMS: Well, they didn't tell us what Norske did and I6029don't suppose they could.

6030 **MR. WALLACE:** I think they have some idea and I think they 6031 have responded in the intervention that they are aware of this, the potential for 6032 projects, and looking at it, but I can again take it back to my client and they can 6033 consider whether they would be in a position to provide useful evidence.

6034 **MR. WILLIAMS:** I am not asking you to change your whole 6035 mind and present evidence of all kinds of nature, I am asking to clarify, have a 6036 witness perhaps clarify where we are at. Because we can't answer the questions or 6037 deal with it if we don't know.

6038 **MR. WALLACE:** I am hopeful, Mr. Williams, that B.C. Hydro 6039 will be able to address that, and address that appropriately. If after Hydro's panel 6040 has not been on -- or has been on -- and has been questioned and there is still a 6041 feeling of a need to hear something from Norske, I would be quite prepared to 6042 take that to my client and see what could be done.

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6043	MR. WILLIAMS: You will take it to your client anyway?
6044	MR. WALLACE: Yes, I will.
6045	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Wallace.
6046	Your intervenor status has been granted and approved, so you are

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6073	MR. JONES: I think my instructions thank you Madam Chair,
6074	I think my instructions have been clear that we have no intention of putting
6075	together a witness panel. Thank you.
6076	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.
6077	We will now hear motions in the order of appearances as set out.
6078	If your motion has been dealt with by the logistical arrangements we have set out
6079	this afternoon, please advise the Panel accordingly when your name is called and
6080	there will be no need to speak to it further.
6081	We will start with Braithwaite Estates.
6082 6083 6084	MR. HUGO: The Notice of Motion is before you. Did you want me to read it through or add supplementary comments or just respond to questions?
6085 6086 6087	THE CHAIRMAN: Well you could add supplementary comments if you wish, or if there is anything further you want to add to what is written. You don't need to read it out because we have the document.
6088	MR. HUGO: Madam Chairman, I believe that the Notice of
6089	Motion is pretty well self-explanatory as it stands. Our concern is having a
6090	convenient access to the and prompt access to the transcripts so that we know
6091	when we have to be back here; and secondly, this is representing sort of a
6092	cumulative effect on our district and on other intervenors as well as far as the
6093	costs that have been kind of growing and growing and growing that were not
6094	anticipated at all towards this hearing when we originally applied. We did not get
6095	into any intervenor funding. I do not intend to be driving from Cobble Hill over
6096	here every day, but I do have to make sure that I am up to date on what is
6097	happening. With a dial-up connection on computer, the downloading of
6098	transcripts on a daily basis becomes just an horrendous task by the time I can log
6099	into the site, have it downloaded and then printed, it becomes a very difficult task
6100	as well. So what I am asking, Madam Chairman, is if we can be accommodated
6101	by having copies of the transcript delivered to us at no extra cost.
6102	As it stands now the transcripts are available but we would have to
6103	pay the delivery cost, and over the duration of the hearing that could be quite
6104	substantial.

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6105**THE CHAIRMAN:** Thank you Mr. Hugo. Are there any parties6106opposed to this motion? Then I am assuming that all parties are in support of the6107motion. That is quite an assumption, I have to admit. Just a moment, please.

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6108 MR. DAVIES: If you are looking either for support or opposition,6109 we are on the fence.

6110 **THE CHAIRMAN:** Thank you, Mr. Davies.

6111 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Hugo, in just the opening statement this
6112 afternoon, we did say that we will establish a phone line where you can phone in
6113 and you can get an update in terms of where you are relative to the proceeding.
6114 We also said that we will update the Web site, which obviously you indicated is
6115 not very convenient for you at this point in time. How would the phone line
6116 facilitate your concern that you have just raised?

6117 **MR. HUGO:** Madam Chairman, this would help to some extent, 6118 but I believe with recorded messages it will be quite limited on what information 6119 you could have on that telephone line, and in order for me to be then properly 6120 briefed and avoid duplication of cross-examination when I do come back at the 6121 appropriate time, it would be convenient -- it would be far better for me if I could 6122 have those transcripts promptly in order that I could prepare. If I am two or three 6123 days behind on the transcripts, I am going to get lost.

6124 THE CHAIRMAN: I understand; but it strikes me as the most
6125 efficient way to really get current transcript is really to go to the Web site because
6126 the Web site is updated faster than the copies that we get. In other words, they
6127 post it on the Web site before they start to make copies for the Panel and everyone
6128 else for that matter.

6129 MR. HUGO: I understand, Madam Chairman. The difficulty,
6130 though, with a dial-up connection is you get timed out and lose the connection
6131 before you can get a major document like that downloaded.

- 6132 THE CHAIRMAN: The Panel will reserve its decision until
 6133 tomorrow. Thank you.
- 6134 MR. HUGO: Madam Chairman, there were some other issues that
 6135 I had raised this morning. Are these to be brought up now or will these come
 6136 later? There were some verbal motions that I was going to raise.
- 6137 **THE CHAIRMAN:** Please go ahead.

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6138 **MR. HUGO:** The first one refers back to actually a letter that I submitted to the secretary on February 9th and raising concern about a few things, 6139 one of them being the cumulative effect that the changes in the process have had 6140 on us. This has included both a substantial, additional time, but a financial 6141 imposition on us as well that was never, ever anticipated. One of the things of 6142 concern, and I go back to the October 1991, I believe it was October 22, 1991 6143 6144 briefing session, pre-briefing session, on the process for the hearings, and at that point I specifically raised the question about where the hearings would be; and 6145 6146 although there is no transcript of the proceedings at that session. I was assured that 6147 every effort would be made to try and have a local component held in each of the major areas that would be affected and that Cobble Hill will likely have a local 6148 6149 component.

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6150 This was one factor that I took into account in not applying for intervenor funding at the time. Not that the funding would have been available, I 6151 am not sure if it would have in any event. At that time it appeared that the process 6152 would entail a review of the application and then the submission of a presentation 6153 6154 on our part afterwards and that there would be very little need for costs; but this 6155 has changed substantially. As everybody is well aware, the whole magnitude of this hearing has totally changed from what anybody I think envisaged a year and a 6156 6157 half ago.

6158 Therefore, Madam Chairman, I would like to put forward a motion
6159 that vehicle mileage allowance be provided for intervenors travelling to and from
6160 these hearings based on current government rates.

6161 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Hugo, are you talking about vehicle
6162 mileage will be paid by who? I am not quite sure if I understand. Is it the Panel?
6163 Is it the Proponent? I mean, the intervenors? Who are we talking about?

6164 **MR. HUGO:** Madam Chairman, to be paid to the intervenors. 6165 Now who would pay this bill? I am not certain whether it would be the NEB, the 6166 federal government, or whether it would be GSX, the Applicant.

6167 THE CHAIRMAN: I am really sorry to advise you, but we don't
6168 have any allowance for funding to pay any of those things that you are talking
6169 about. As you very well know, the Board has no jurisdiction at all on
6170 compensation in any way, shape or form, so unfortunately we are not able to
6171 entertain this motion.

6172 **MR. HUGO:** Okay.

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6173 6174 6175 6176 6177 6178 6179	Madam Chairman, the next concern was about Information Request No. 36 which was issued by the Joint Review Panel, by the secretary, on February 19th. The response is due on the 26th. Several sections in that Information Request pertain to the hydrogeology which is of major concern to Braithwaite. This is the primary concern, as a matter of fact, of our intervention. Until this response is filed we won't know what information is in that and whether or not we will have questions for cross-examination on that, on that information.
6180 6181 6182 6183	So I am not sure at this point, Madam Chairman, whether it would be appropriate to make a motion asking that the cross-examination be deferred until a period of approximately five days after that information is provided. Would that be in order?
6184 6185 6186 6187 6188	THE CHAIRMAN: I think, Mr. Hugo, my suggestion is we don't know the response, and we haven't seen it of course, so you are not in a position to determine at this point whether the response satisfies you in any way, shape or form. Wouldn't it maybe be more prudent to see the response first before you file a motion as to what you are going to go next?
6189 6190	MR. HUGO: As a matter of procedure, Madam Chairman, is it permissible to enter a motion during the proceedings later on in the proceedings?
6191 6192	THE CHAIRMAN: Certainly you could bring a motion forward any time during the proceedings if it is relevant, of course.
6193 6194 6195	MR. HUGO: If that is the case, Madam Chairman, then that would resolve my concern at this point for that information request and if I could introduce it later on.
6196 6197 6198 6199	Similarly, the new design provisions that have come out of the agreements that GSX has made with the landowners have just been made available. So after I have had a chance to review those I may wish to come back and ask for a little additional time on those.
6200	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Hugo.
6201	MR. HUGO: Thank you, Madam Chairman.
6202	THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Campbell?
6203 6204	MR. CAMPBELL: I have made an arrangement with Mr. Davies that I can bring my motion for an exhibit tomorrow and also I am bringing an

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exhibit tomorrow for the -- the NEB materials that Mr. Andrews is submitting as 6205 6206 a motion. Thank you. 6207 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Campbell. 6208 Dr. Fisher? 6209 Mr. Miller, I see you are up. Perhaps you could wait until we hear 6210 from Dr. Fisher and then you could present us with your ---6211 **MR. MILLER:** I might be able to negotiate access with Mr. 6212 Fisher. 6213 **THE CHAIRMAN:** Speak into the microphone, please. 6214 **MR. MILLER:** I guess I am rising on a point of privilege, or whatever you call that, but I am only a very new student of this procedure, having 6215 taken the course yesterday. During that course we were informed that in the 6216 6217 process of hearing argument about motions that those who supported a motion would have the chance to speak and those opposed would have the chance to 6218 speak. You have established a procedure of sort of a negative check- off. You 6219 6220 have asked whether anyone is opposed. And you have only entertained argument 6221 from the proponent of the motion. So that means that if there is any further argument in support, you haven't left yourself the opportunity to hear it. 6222 6223 So with respect to the motion of Mr. Hugo, I do have a point that I would like to say in support, I am just wondering where in your procedure I would 6224 6225 be invited to give that comment rather than stand up in the way I have. 6226 **THE CHAIRMAN:** Yes, is that comment relative to the ruling 6227 we have already made? 6228 **MR. MILLER:** I think you said you were deferring the decision 6229 on Mr. Hugo's question about transcripts. 6230 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. So we have reserved that until tomorrow and that's what you wish to speak to? Okay. 6231 6232 **MR. MILLER:** So in general, if I would like to speak in support of a motion, can you advise me as to when I could do that? If I am not the 6233 Proponent of the motion? 6234

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6235	THE CHAIRMAN: Well I think we have a long list, so I am
6236	trying to go through the list as quickly as we can. So typically parties who are
6237	opposed, I say, well, okay let's hear from parties who are opposed? And
6238	presumably if you are in support of the motion, if you wish to speak, maybe you
6239	could advise us accordingly. Otherwise, we will have to go through the whole list
6240	and that takes quite a long time.
6241	MR. MILLER: I will. So then I would stand up as I did?
6242	THE CHAIRMAN: You will raise your hand and I will
6243	acknowledge you. Yes, thank you.
6244	MR. MILLER: I have got something to say in support of that
6245	motion, but I will leave it to you to decide when you can hear that.
6246	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.
6247	Well, since I see that Mrs. Miller has her hand up, maybe I could
6248	get the two of you to do it together. We might as well.
6249	MRS. MILLER: Thank you. I only raised my hand because you
6250	just indicated that that is your preferred method of asking a question.
6251	I am confused as to how a ruling could be made on the motions
6252	that were only briefly given an overview this morning without the proposers of
6253	those motions having had an opportunity to even address them fully and I am just
6254	wondering how this I am really confused, because the process that was
6255	explained to us yesterday afternoon, not 24 hours ago, was that when a motion
6256	was proposed, the person proposing the motion had an opportunity to address the
6257	facts, factual basis, and reasons for that motion. Any parties in support of that
6258	motion were able to come forward in the order of appearances and make their
6259	comments in support, or in opposition, and that the Panel would then take all that
6260	information into account prior to making their ruling.
6261	And yet this morning when we presented just the brief topic
6262	headings of those motions, it appears that the Panel was able to come back after
6263	lunch and, without even hearing the detail of our motions, rule adversely upon
6264	those motions; and unless I misunderstood what you said, we now no longer have
6265	any opportunity to further raise those concerns. And pardon me, but this raises a
6266	very serious concern in my mind as to how I am going to be able to participate in
6267	a process where the decisions are made before I had a chance to participate.
6268	

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6269	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs. Miller. I believe that the
6270	decision we made this afternoon is mostly regarding scheduling and how to
6271	accommodate this hearing and get it to move forward. And I believe that
6272	scheduling ruling is really at the discretion of the Panel.
6273	
6274	In other words, we've had conflicting suggestions to have different
6275	times, and the Panel has to be able to make a decision to keep things moving. So
6276	that's what we've done.
6277	
6278	With respect to the transcripts, we've reserved that decision. And
6279	so certainly you are welcome to argue on that particular issue.
6280	
6281	MRS. MILLER: Again, with respect, I don't think you are
6282	grasping the essence of what I'm trying to say.
6283	
6284	I, in all innocence, was following the procedure that had been
6285	outlined to me in the session yesterday and I found when I returned from the lunch
6286	hour that the rules had been changed, and this is very disconcerting and I don't
6287	believe that it is fair for the information, and maybe it will encourage the Panel to
6288	revisit its decision.
6289	
6290	When I brought forward my motion regarding scheduling, I was
6291	unaware of the fact that Susie and Ian Washington Smyth were bringing forward a
6292	somewhat contradictory motion as, of course, there was no way that I could have
6293	known that because they were both brought forward in the course of registering.
6294	
6295	Susie, Ian and myself took the opportunity before the
6296	commencement of the afternoon session to confer to try and reach an agreeable
6297	compromise that would facilitate the I can't even remember what word you
6298	used the flow of the hearing, I guess. And not only did we confer amongst
6299	ourselves, but we spoke to Mr. Davies and, amongst all of us, we had reached
6300	what we all felt was a very reasonable compromise.
6301	
6302	I am now at a loss as to how all the parties who have reached an agreement can
6303	put this agreement to the Panel who have made a decision without knowing what
6304	the parties have agreed to, and which will be a much more satisfactory solution to
6305	those of us who are involved than the solution the Panel has brought forward.
6306	And I really would appreciate your assistance in helping me understand this
6307	logical cleft stick which you have placed me in.
6308	
6309	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs. Miller. I think I understand
6310	better who you are. Certainly, I think, if we didn't make a decision, the process

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6311	would be stopped because we couldn't commence tomorrow morning. So a
6312	decision had to be made quickly as you, I'm sure, appreciate. However, in light of
6313	what you've said, you've reached a compromise; I think we would be interested in
6314	knowing what the compromise is and we'll reconsider that decision. Thank you.
6315	
6316	MRS. MILLER: So I will come and explain that when it comes
6317	up in the order of appearances?
6318	
6319	THE CHAIRMAN: Why don't you do that right now since you
6320	have the podium any way?
6321	
6322	MRS. MILLER: Okay. May I just go and get the notes?
6323	
6324	THE CHAIRMAN: Certainly.
6325	- -
6326	MRS. MILLER: I wonder if Mr. Davies can assist me in this?
6327	
6328	MR. DAVIES: Maybe I can assist, Madam Chair, because I think
6329	to some extent we're talking at cross-purposes here.
6330	
6331	As I understood the Panel's ruling, it was, in essence, that we can't
6332	make everybody happy all the time. We have to have some hours but, having said
6333	that, the Panel is prepared to be flexible such that if we were to find tomorrow that
6334	we needed to start at 8:30 to accommodate an intervenor, we might do that. If the
6335	following day it wouldn't work to start until ten o'clock, we would do that. Maybe
6336	there's some days we would sit a little bit later.
6337	
6338	And what I had said to Mrs. Miller and Ms Washington Smyth is,
6339	as the Applicant, we're certainly prepared to be flexible to try to accommodate
6340	people. We know the Panel is as well. And so we're trying to balance the
6341	accommodation with the need to be efficient.
6342	
6343	And my suggestion was that as we move forward here between the
6344	Applicant, Panel and its staff and the intervenors, I'm sure we can manage this
6345	process on a go-forward basis. And, as I say, we're certainly prepared to do what
6346	we can to assist. So I hope that helps and I'd invite you to add anything that you
6347	like.
6348	
6349	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Davies. Mrs. Miller, please
6350	proceed.
6351	
6352	MRS. MILLER: Thank you very much. And thank you.

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6353	
6354	What Ms Washington Smyth and myself agreed would probably
6355	work most expeditiously would be to have a flexible scheduling, perhaps to
6356	alternate the start of hearing times to accommodate the needs of intervenors who
6357	are coming from the outer Gulf Islands and have ferry constraints, and the needs
6358	of intervenors who are coming from the Cobble Hill and north area and who have
6359	driving distance constraints.
6360	
6361	For those of us on island, a ten o'clock start time is preferable
6362	because it allows us to avoid the heavy traffic, which sometimes ends up
6363	gridlocked in Victoria at commuter rush hour, or to and also to avoid having to
6364	leave even earlier than otherwise might be necessary so that we can get ahead of
6365	the rush. It would allow us to slip into a window where we could drive straight
6366	through.
6367	
6368	It seems to me that on a day-by-day or case-by-case basis we could
6369	look at or the Panel could look at whether the Marine Coalition, which is the
6370	are the primary people involved from the Gulf Islands, are going to be coming up
6371	in either cross-examination or presentation of witness panels and make an
6372	announcement on the preceding day that the following day the hearing will begin
6373	at nine o'clock as they requested, and perhaps that on all other days the hearing
6374	begin at ten o'clock, unless someone comes forward with another reasonable
6375	request on a case-by-case basis. And there doesn't seem to be any disagreement
6376	on this as a method of accommodating the needs of everyone instead of no one.
6377	
6378	Which, with respect, the Panel's initial ruling was: if you can't
6379	make everyone happy, make everyone equally unhappy. And, you know, as long
6380	as I would request that the Panel staff coordinate the flow of start times and
6381	publish them in advance on the Web site, or in and also make an announcement
6382	at the end of each day, or put it on the message machine, or whatever works best,
6383	so that interested parties can arrange their schedules in accordance with the
6384	floating start and stop times.
6385	
6386	And I think that would probably address most of the scheduling
6387	concerns, except for perhaps what was brought up in Mairi McLennan's motion,
6388	which was that at least one cross-examination session be scheduled for each
6389	Applicant panel be scheduled during evening hours. And that could be as I see
6390	it, that could be accommodated and more fully facilitate the participation of
6391	members of the public by having the hearing on one day per panel. For example,
6392	begin in the afternoon session and continue over into an evening session as
6393	opposed to starting in the morning and ending in the afternoon. And in the
6394	motions there were some additional accommodations that were requested.

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6395	
6396	I really would encourage the Panel to look at the spirit rather than
6397	the letter of the spirit of what was referred to earlier, the agreement between the
6398	National Energy Board and the Minister of the Environment of August 15th, 2001
6399	in 4.3.2(c):
6400	
6401	"The Panel shall conduct its review in a manner which will
6402	promote and facilitate public participation."
6403	
6404	I think if the public is meaningfully consulted about how their
6405	participation can be facilitated, we would avoid a lot of delay by people such as
6406	myself who find themselves backed up against the wall metaphorically.
6407	
6408	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs. Miller. I believe Mr. Miller
6409	had something to say. So is that covered off? Oh, thank you. Thank you, Mrs.
6410	Miller, for your presentation.
6411	
6412	I think in a way your presentation is not really that dissimilar from
6413	what we are trying to do probably, except the early morning start. I think the
6414	Panel is trying very hard to be flexible and to try and accommodate parties to the
6415	best extent that we can. And tomorrow for sure we'll have to start at 9:30 because
6416	that is the schedule that we said we will start with, and that will be the schedule
6417	we'll go with.
6418	
6419	However, on a going-forward basis, if Saturna Community Club,
6420	or something or the other, they have to be here to present their evidence, and their
6421	argument, they need to start at 9:00, then we have to consider that and we have to
6422	make allowances for that.
6423	
6424	So it will be very difficult to make a ruling a blanket ruling that
6425	we're going to start at this time, but we're certainly willing to accommodate parties
6426	and take those into consideration when the issue comes up. But tomorrow we will
6427	start at 9:30.
6428	
6429	MRS. MILLER: Has there been any consideration to the request
6430	of accommodating intervenors who are driving over the Malahat to attend this
6431	hearing in Sidney of moving the start time for other days to ten o'clock instead of
6432	9:30 on a regular basis, unless someone needs a special dispensation?
6433	
6434	THE CHAIRMAN: We're not able to do this every day, but we're
6435	able to accommodate it on certain days when parties are appearing from that area.
6436	In other words, we'll accommodate the schedule to the extent possible.

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6437	
6438	If you are presenting your evidence and you can't start till 10:00,
6439	we are willing to consider that, but we would not make a ruling that we'll start
6440	every day at 10:00.
6441	
6442	MRS. MILLER: Okay. But you're also not making a ruling that
6443	every day we will start at 9:30, except if the Marine Coalition needs to come
6444	earlier; it will be done on a case-by-case basis?
6445	
6446	THE CHAIRMAN: It will be done on almost a daily basis,
6447	except tomorrow we'll start in at 9:30.
6448	
6449	MRS. MILLER: Oh, fair enough, because it's short notice. And
6450	to whom should intervenors who have a particular start time request address this
6451	question on the day-to-day basis?
6452	question on the day to day busis.
6453	THE CHAIRMAN: Well, I suggest you address that to your
6454	favourite counsel, Ms Hanebury.
6455	avourie couriser, ivis francoury.
6456	MRS. MILLER: They're all my favourites. I don't play
6457	favourites.
6458	lavouries.
6459	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Thank you. Dr. Fisher?
6460	THE CHAIRMAN, ORay. Thank you. Dr. Tisher?
6461	MR. DAVIES: Are calls after midnight accepted?
6462	WIR. DAVIES. Are cans after intellight accepted?
6463	THE CHAIRMAN: She's ignoring that.
6464	THE CHAIRMAN. She's ignoring that.
6465	MR. FISHER: Yes.
6466	WR. FISHER. 105.
6467	THE CHAIRMAN: Please proceed.
6468	THE CHAIRMAN. Thease proceed.
6469	MR. FISHER: Professors are notoriously absentminded and I'm a
6470	retired professor and also burdened with senior moments, so what are we doing?
6471	Tetred professor and also burdened with senior moments, so what are we doing?
6472	MD WILLIAMS, What was your full name again sir?
6473	MR. WILLIAMS: What was your full name again, sir?
6474	MD EISHED. Loon remember my name but
6475	MR. FISHER: I can remember my name but
6475 6476	THE CHAIDMAN. If I recallect what you said you had
6476 6477	THE CHAIRMAN: If I recollect what you said, you had
6477 6478	something you had a list of documents, which I believe those have been included on our exhibit list, so I think we've addressed those. Correct me if I'm
04/0	meruded on our exhibit fist, so I think we've addressed hiose. Confect hie if I fill

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6479 6480 6481 6482	wrong, Madame Painchaud, but I think you also had something about Revenue Canada news release, which I'm not sure has already been included, and I don't know if Mr. Davies has seen that or other intervenors.
6483 6484 6485 6486	MR. FISHER: I got the news release back and I have to make 15 copies for the Panel here and some sufficient copies to go in the back there. But that's been taken care of.
6487 6488	THE CHAIRMAN: That has been taken care of?
6489 6490	MR. FISHER: Well, I've got to do the photocopying.
6491 6492	THE CHAIRMAN: Oh, okay.
6493 6494 6495	MR. FISHER: Somehow I have to find a photocopier that's open in time for me to drive from Cobble Hill to here tomorrow.
6496 6497 6498	MR. DAVIES: If Dr. Fisher would like to give me the document, we'll photocopy it before tomorrow morning.
6498 6500	MR. FISHER: Thank you very much. I will.
6501 6502 6503	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you Mr. Davies. Thank you, Dr. Fisher. GSX CCC?
6504 6505	MR. ANDREWS: Our motion was dealt with.
6506 6507 6508	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Andrews. Shady Brook Farms?
6509 6510 6511	I think before you start you had a prefiled motion. So I just want to give me a moment here and we'll address that first.
6512 6513 6514 6515 6516	Mr. Miller, the pre-filed motion was Mrs. Miller and Ms McLennan I believe. That's the pre-filed motion that I'm talking about which references a list of document numbers from the Web site as opposed to exhibit numbers.
6517 6518 6519 6520	Before we get to that motion from Shady Brook Farm and Ms McLennan, which is dated 17 February 2003, I'd like to say something about documents in this proceeding.

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6521	Are you ready to proceed, Mr. Miller?
6522	
6523	MR. MILLER: I am.
6524	
6525	THE CHAIRMAN: Oh, okay. In the Shady Brook Farm motion
6526	there is a listing of some documents filed by GSX PL with reference to the
6527	identification numbers on the electronic filing system of the Board.
6528	
6529	For example, the motion refers to document numbers A05193,
6530	A05201, A05252, A05314, A05323 and A05342. This is not the correct method
6531	for referring to documents in this hearing.
6532	
6533	As in most hearings before courts and tribunals, it's our practice to
6534	refer to documents on the record by exhibit number. This way all parties can
6535	readily know what document is being referred to and can literally be reading from
6536	the same page. Not all parties have access to the Livelink document filing system
6537	and it is not readily accessible in the hearing room.
6538	
6539	There have been thousands of pages of material filed so far in this
6540	proceeding and it's important that, when a witness refers to a specific document,
6541	the witness and all other parties can find that document quickly.
6542	
6543	Exhibits are generally filed in chronological order with the letter
6544	identifying who filed the document. "A" exhibits are documents for the Joint
6545	Panel; "B" documents are those for the Applicant; and "C" exhibits are those for
6546	the intervenors.
6547	
6548	The documents referred to in the Shady Brook Farm motion were
6549	numbered by the electronic filing document. The proper reference numbers
6550	their proper reference numbers are Exhibit B-101, Exhibit B-102, Exhibit B-103,
6551	Exhibit B-106, Exhibit B-107, and Exhibit B-109.
6552	
6553	The Panel did a cross-reference to identify the exhibit numbers in
6554	this case; however, in the future the Panel would ask that you refer to documents
6555	by the appropriate exhibit number.
6556	
6557	This is an exhibit number list there is an exhibit number list in
6558	the back of the room and a description of the documents on that list should be
6559	enough to help you to cross-reference the documents.
6560	Thank you. You may proceed, please.
6561	

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6562	MR. MILLER: First of all, thank you for that information. I
6563	should point out that information does not correspond to what we were told
6564	yesterday. So I'm not adverse to learning about your procedure. I am adverse to
6565	learning about it on very short notice.
6566	
6567	As we pointed out, I spared you the list of 23 things that inhibited
6568	public input, but this is one of them. Correlation to your exhibit numbers is a
6569	chore. We don't have secretarial assistance. We're quite willing, however,
6570	to do it, but we do require proper notice and we haven't received it. So I would
6571	like to see an avoidance of, first of all, this type of miscue and this type of late
6572	notice for the rest of the hearing, please.
6573	
6574	THE CHAIRMAN: I understand and I appreciate that. That's
6575	why we took the lead to search this out for you so you didn't have to do that today.
6576	MD MULTED. Obser The activity of this method is similar to
6577	MR. MILLER: Okay. The principle of this motion is similar to
6578	the general theme that you've been hearing so far today, and it's the notion of
6579	overloading intervenors with information at late date, and not to mention the
6580	provision of a level playing field.
6581	
6582	So we have a situation on the one hand in which the Proponent is
6583	both providing and being asked for a flood of evidence that is coming just prior to
6584	this hearing and that will, as you've heard from Mr. Hugo, will also arrive during
6585	the hearing.
6586	
6587	At the same time as permitting that, we have a situation where
6588	evidence attempted to be filed by intervenors is rejected from the record on the
6589	grounds that it is too late. That is not, in our view, a level playing field and that's
6590	why we asked for redress and a levelling of that field either by accepting the
6591	intervenor evidence that had been sent in or by rejecting the superfluous
6592	Proponent information that had also been sent in.
6593	
6594	THE CHAIRMAN: Is there anything else? I want you to go
6595	through all your motions and then, you know, we'll make a decision accordingly.
6596	
6597	MR. MILLER: Are you talking about other motions from Shady
6598	Brook?
6599	
6600	THE CHAIRMAN: Sorry. If you're finished with the pre-filed
6601	motions, then you could go to the other motions filed by Shady Brook.
6602	

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6603	MR. MILLER: Okay. Also, at the same time, the motion from
6604	Mairi McLennan, she has asked me to speak to it as well. And both the Shady
6605	Brook motion and the Mairi McLennan motions are basically on the same issue,
6606	which is the one that Dodie Miller spoke about, which is the scheduling issue.
6607	And I just have two more things to add about that.
6608	
6609	One is that with respect to the motion from Shady Brook Farm
6610	action sought, number one, that the commencement of each GSX PL witness
6611	panel be deferred to the beginning of the new day. I believe that we reached
6612	agreement, not only with a selection of intervenors here, but also with Mr. Davies,
6613	and you could confirm that, that that might not be a bad idea.
6614	
6615	MR. DAVIES: No, we hadn't discussed that.
6616	
6617	MR. MILLER: Okay. So in that case I will give my reasons in
6618	favour of just that one point since we've already dealt with a lot of this in
6619	principle.
6620	
6621	And in this once again I want to call your attention to the basis
6622	upon which this Panel was established and the element of your agreement that has
6623	already been read to you concerning promoting the public participation.
6624	
6625	With the panels in principle with no further comment from this
6626	Panel, with the witness panels in principle capable of all running in a single day,
6627	because there's nothing that has been said by this Panel that would preclude that, a
6628	single day it could happen in two days, three days; this could be over by
6629	Thursday for all we know. It means on the other hand, we also have an
6630	estimate. I'm not sure quite where this was published or mentioned could have
6631	been in our course yesterday that this proceeding could take four weeks.
6632	
6633	Now, you could satisfy yourself that among the population of
6634	Vancouver Island what the proportion of that population is that has four weeks
6635	available free from work to sit in this hearing room. It is patently unreasonable to
6636	expect that the public, or the intervenors that are from the public and are not
6637	represented by counsel would sit here for four consecutive weeks free from any
6638	work obligations. If you look at what the demographics is of this Island, or the
6639	demographics of Canada, you will see that actually that's an impossible request.
6640	And if you make an impossible request contrary to your terms of reference, then
6641	that is something you should consider really seriously.
6642	
6643	However, the proposal that is in our motion would mitigate that
6644	significantly; that in that way people could see on which day they need to attend.

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6645 And there would be no possibility that their appearance or their interest would 6646 pass them by and be gone while they were waiting for a ferry from some outer 6647 Island or caught in a traffic jam as they attempted a three-and-a-half-hour commute from Nanaimo. 6648 6649 6650 So if you -- we've been sort of hammering the scheduling topic quite a lot. So far I haven't been able to detect, really, much accommodation. 6651 Mairi McLennan -- the reason I'm speaking on her behalf, she is working today, 6652 6653 she works every day, and she wants to participate in this proceeding. She is being 6654 sealed out, and so far I have heard nothing that would give her even the slightest glimmer. She might apply to you for a chance to address you in the evening, that 6655 would be a test, but that would be quite an unusual situation as opposed to 6656 6657 scheduling some evening sessions. It is not unreasonable in the Canadian context of the work force for that request to be made. 6658 6659 6660 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Miller. I think the Panel -with respect to deferring the witnesses till a new day, the Panel has really made a 6661 ruling on that, unless there is new information that we're not aware of, certainly 6662 then we're willing to reconsider. 6663 6664 6665 The logistics of it makes it really difficult. In other words, if we have a new panel and we don't have many questions for that panel, and the panel 6666 6667 is only questioned for two hours, let's say for example, then we'll have to shut down the rest of the hearing till the following day. That's not very efficient use of 6668 time. We are willing to accommodate parties to the extent possible. 6669 6670 6671 For example, I'm not sure if this is possible, but if Ms McLennan wanted to have you or someone do their cross-examination for them, that could be 6672 6673 done and probably we could schedule an evening session or some other session that could accommodate her schedule to present final argument, or something to 6674 6675 that effect in person, because that will be her views in terms of what she wants to 6676 say. 6677 So we are trying very hard to work with parties, even though it 6678 doesn't seem that way from where you are, but we are doing our best to 6679 6680 accommodate, you know, the different schedules that you've talked about. You know, we've looked at it. We've tried to look at how efficient it is to run this 6681 6682 hearing. And, from an efficiency point of view, it's very difficult to run one panel 6683 a day. 6684 6685 If the questions only last for half an hour, we have to adjourn for the rest of the day. That seems to be a little problematic. 6686

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6687 6688 Well, if a party wanted to cross-examine that particular panel, you 6689 know, we are willing to make arrangements to see how we could accommodate them to come in and do a cross-examination, for example, if there's a particular 6690 panel you're interested in, or have something else do the cross for them. 6691 6692 6693 qSo I think your concern is well noted. And I think your concern is partly addressed, if not all. 6694 6695 6696 **MR. MILLER:** I have a suggestion, and I see that Dodie has one, too, prior comment about efficiency. You are obtaining tremendous efficiency by 6697 holding this hearing in only one location and in this location. That means if you 6698 6699 have available to you some benefits of that efficiency that you could share. That 6700 is to say, if you had to take this structure down and reset it up at Arbutus Ridge, there would be a delay of some days. You are having efficiencies and we're only 6701 6702 asking that you share a bit of that. 6703 6704 One of the possibilities, and I don't know if this is what Dodie has in mind, but even if you do not schedule each of the eight panels at the beginning 6705 6706 of a new day, you could at least publish a schedule for them in a pair-wise 6707 manner, or indicate the near-term scheduling that this panel might be held tomorrow or the next day. But -- let's say the next day or the day after, but not 6708 6709 tomorrow, or any guidance of this type that would allow working people to make arrangements to be here. 6710 6711 6712 **MRS. MILLER:** What I was going to suggest as a reasonable approach, I feel a reasonable approach -- sorry, I shouldn't assume -- would be to 6713 perhaps halfway through the list of parties -- is that what it's called? -- the order 6714 6715 of appearances. Sorry. It would be reasonably evident if this was going to be zooming along, or if there were going to be -- if there was going to be another day 6716 or perhaps two days, I mean if we're at "B" in the alphabet it's unlikely that we're 6717 6718 going to get through the entire panel by the end of the sitting of one day. And perhaps once the halfway mark of the alphabet had been reached, or of the 6719 intervenor list, people could indicate to Panel counsel if they were intending to 6720 6721 question that panel. And once you had -- closer to the time of that panel being --6722 what's the word? Called? Thank you. You could inquire for a list -- rather than 6723 having to call everybody by name and have them not be here because they didn't realize that their attendance was required, perhaps they could be pulled, or they 6724 6725 could make a phone call and say, "I'm going to have questions. I'm going to have questions," and so on, and then it would give the Panel -- it would give the 6726 6727 Review Panel, it would give the intervenors, it would give Mr. Davies and his witnesses all a much better idea as to how the thing was going to flow. And so it 6728

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6729	might be evident that two panels were going to overlap on one day, and that could
6730	be notified in advance and then people could plan accordingly.
6731	
6732	What we are humbly requesting is that some additional effort be
6733	put into accommodating the lives of the intervenors, some of whom have put in
6734	thousands of hours over a three year time span, and now when it comes down to
6735	the payoff we are feeling increasingly closed out of a process that we have been
6736	repeatedly assured is designed to promote and facilitate public participation and
6737	that at the end of which a decision will be made about a certificate of public
6738	convenience and necessity.
6739	
6740	I think the public is being lost in the process.
6741	
6742	Thank you.
6743	
6744	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs. Miller. Actually, I think
6745	your suggestion if we go back to the opening statements, some of that
6746	suggestion has already been captured. I mean, we're setting up a phone line where
6747	you can phone in and you can find out in the proceedings where we are. We are
6748	updating the Web site every day to tell you where we are and what panels will be
6749	called next. So we're doing our best to accommodate you. As I said earlier, it
6750	may not be evident, but we are doing our best.
6751	
6752	Thank you.
6753	
6754	MRS. MILLER: And it is much appreciated. I think a lot of
6755	times, unfortunately, the level of frustration and the perceived feeling of being left
6756	out of the process are going to spill over and you will be the unwilling and
6757	unintended recipients of that frustration, and I do apologize for that.
6758	
6759	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.
6760	
6761	MS HANEBURY: Perhaps I can just interject at this point,
6762	Madam Chair, to advise that I already have a schedule set-up, and I will be
6763	meeting with people throughout the hearing process to assess where we
6764	stand/what the logistics are. It's a normal part of the Panel process that I sort of
6765	huddle before at the start of each day over lunch and again at the end of each day
6766	to sort of scope out what's going to happen for the next day. So you're welcome to
6767	and I'm sure you'll join in in that process and I'm ready to go.
6768	
6769	MRS. MILLER: And that is much appreciated. But, again, this
6770	is new information that's coming out now instead of information that could have

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6771	been made available. And I hate to carp on this, but if there had been some
6772	additional effort made to include the public in the planning of this process, if even
6773	the accommodation had been made to the request to hold the information session
6774	a week or two earlier, a lot of this delay would have definitely been avoided.
6775	
6776	We are playing catch-up and we are really struggling and we have
6777	to ask the indulgence of the Panel and of counsel and of Mr. Davies, and of all the
6778	other intervenors who are lawyers, because we, without in spite of everyone's
6779	best intentions, the fact remains that we are not on a level playing field. We are in
6780	the middle of the game and we're still learning the rules. And, through no fault of
6781	our own, we are disadvantaged. And I'm not sure what the legal definition of
6782	prejudice is. I've heard it said, but the perception amongst significant number of
6783	intervenors is that we are in a situation where we are being prejudiced because we
6784	are unable to participate fully because of a lack of knowledge and there is a real
6785	fear that, through our lack of knowledge, we will find out what we should have
6786	done after it's too late to have done it.
6787	
6788	And I think Steve has one more part of the motion that he wanted
6789	to address.
6790	
6791	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Actually, before you leave, I just
6792	realized that you had a motion, but I don't know if you had enough copies
6793	available or not for parties to look at.
6794	
6795	MRS. MILLER: They're at the back of the room and they've been
6796	distributed.
6797	
6798	THE CHAIRMAN: Back of the room and they've been
6799	distributed. Thank you.
6800	
6801	MRS. MILLER: Yes.
6802	
6803	MR. MILLER: I don't want to address another part. I guess I'm
6804	still standing here to see if we are talking about the pre-filed motion still.
6805	
6806	MRS. MILLER: No, we've moved on.
6807	
6808	THE CHAIRMAN: Your pre-filed motion is the one that Mrs.
6809	Miller and Ms McLennan filed about the rejection of documents. Okay. And
6810	we're just going to go back and see if other parties have comments on those.
6811	
6812	Unless there is anything else.

Okay.

6815

MR. ANDREWS: William Andrews for the GSX CCC.

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6816 What I would like to say relates to the comment of The Chair on 6817 the references to documents, and I certainly accept that we operate on the basis of 6818 exhibit numbers in this hearing. I want to check out, however, that these 6819 documents have been in circulation and in use for many, many, many months, but 6820 have not had exhibit numbers assigned until very, very recently, and it's extremely difficult for people who have trouble enough dealing with the paperwork to then, 6821 within days of the hearing and having to file pre-filed evidence, some of which 6822 6823 was written before the exhibit list even was produced, to then impose on their 6824 entire system of cataloguing this vast array of information an entirely new numbering system. With respect, I think, perhaps the Panel might want to 6825 6826 comment at the end on the advisability of assigning documents, exhibit numbers, at least for identification purposes as they are received and put on the Web site so 6827 6828 that we don't have to re-invent the wheel a few days before the hearing.

THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Andrews. I think certainly I
do understand the frustration you have expressed. The exhibit numbers were sent
out I think maybe a week or so ago, I don't recall exactly the date. But it's just for
ease of reference. When we had the Web site those numbers were adequate
because we didn't have to worry about exhibit numbers and people could go and
look up those numbers. Here in this hearing room we don't have access to those.

6835 For example, you know, Mrs. Miller's motion about the Web site 6836 numbers, we had one of our staff members practically physically look up the 6837 numbers and go through the exhibit list to try to cross-reference that, and they were doing that until midnight and I realized, yeah, okay, that is very difficult, but 6838 it's better than asking them to do it today. So we have to make accommodations 6839 6840 for things like that. So we tried to do that. But parties have time from now until you present your evidence and your argument, you could go through that exhibit 6841 list because it is constantly being updated. I don't think it is going to be too 6842 6843 onerous because you have the date and you have the party whose letter you are 6844 referring to. So hopefully it should be relatively easy to do that, I hope.

6845 MR. ANDREWS: I don't think, with respect, it is not going to be
6846 any easier than it took the staff to go through until late at night, so anybody who
6847 had prepared any cross-examination before the exhibit list came out then has to go
6848 through that same late night process. My point is just that it is unnecessary. If the

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exhibit numbers were put on as the documents came in we would eliminate thatentire additional loop.

- THE CHAIRMAN: Your point is well taken. Thank you.
 Mrs. Miller we haven't asked for comments on your motion yet.
 MRS. MILLER: [Off microphone]
 THE CHAIRMAN: Could we deal with your motion first?
 MRS. MILLER: I might have a senior moment -- I forget what I am trying to say.
- 6859**THE CHAIRMAN:** Please come to the microphone because we6860can't hear a word that you are saying.
- 6861 **MRS. MILLER:** I was saying that I may not be chronologically a 6862 senior, but I am suffering from occasional senior moments also and I am afraid I 6863 might forget what I wanted to say, and it was as a follow-up to what Mr. Andrews 6864 just presented to you. And again, I am really sorry for taking up so much time, but 6865 I feel that it's really critical that these issues get dealt with at the beginning rather 6866 than halfway through.
- In the information session yesterday, we were specifically told -and I think this can be confirmed by the people who presented the session, that it
 was not necessary for us to reference documents in any particular fashion, that it
 was adequate for us to reference by exhibit number, it would be okay to reference
 by date of filing, or by whatever the number is on the website, which, believe me,
 I am not computer literate enough to even be able to get on the darned thing let
 alone -- navigate? Navigate. I am just learning the terminology.
- I find it really a subject of much concern -- I am sorry -- we were
 also told that it didn't matter which form of reference we used, because there was
 ample Panel staff available and if we made a reference under any one of those
 systems, the Panel staff would very rapidly cross-reference it and locate the
 document in whichever format was most appropriate.
- 6879 Again, with respect, I feel that the rules are being changed as we 6880 are in the middle of playing the game, and this is not fair.

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6881	And I would like to put forward a motion that references to
6882	materials filed as exhibits or in evidence be accepted using whatever reference
6883	format the person referring to them finds most comfortable. Some of us who are
6884	not of the new computer age fully will most likely find it most convenient to refer
6885	to the letter from the Panel dated September 21, 2001 and we can give the heading
6886	of the letter, and let the people who understand the system and who have access to
6887	the exhibit list and understand how it works and don't have to spend 20 minutes
6888	trying to read through the entire list to find everything and who are being paid to
6889	do this, let them do their jobs.
6890	THE CHAIRMAN: Well you just introduced another motion, so
6891	we will just have to go through and deal with your motions. Let's deal with what
6892	we started with first.
6893	MRS. MILLER: I can't remember what it is. I hope you can.
6894	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Is there any well, maybe a show of
6895	hands will speed this up, but is there any party who wishes to speak with respect
6896	to the motions filed by Mrs. Miller and Mrs. McLennan and the motion about
6897	having the witness panel be deferred to a new day each day. We could reconsider
6898	our new material if necessary.
6899	I mean if you wish to speak of it in support or against it, it would
6900	be nice to see hands and see how many people.
6901	MRS. MILLER: Are you asking if anyone opposes it or supports
6902	it?
6903	THE CHAIRMAN: Both.
6904	MRS. MILLER: These are answers to a double question.
6905	THE CHAIRMAN: No, just show hands to see the number and
6906	then we will sort out the for and the against. Okay. Thank you. So I have seen
6907	three hands.
6908	Perhaps we will listen to those in support of the motion first. Mr.
6909	Campbell?
6910	MR. CAMPBELL: I would very much like to see the Panel
6911	accommodate one evening's sitting, if that's at all possible. I can guarantee that
6912	the amount of material that Mairi McLennan has produced is just incredible when

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6913 6914 6915 6916	I had an opportunity to talk to her the other night and, you know, she is up until 12:00 and 1:00 in the morning and she is very concerned about this whole application, and I really think that if you can accommodate an evening session, one or two, or even more, I think that would be well in order. Thank you.
6917 6918	THE CHAIRMAN: I think I saw another hand somewhere else. I am not sure. Mr. Jones?
6919 6920 6921 6922 6923	MR. JONES: Sorry, Madam Chair, I may be slightly confused myself. I was going to make some comments with respect to the motion brought by Ms McLennan and Shady Brook Farm referencing material that CAC (B.C.) <i>et al.</i> and VIPLA had to put in. I think that Mr. Davies, as I understand it, may be speaking to that, so I am happy to wait in that respect. Thank you.
6924	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Jones.
6925	Mr. Davies?
6926 6927	MR. DAVIES: Sorry, are we on the new panel-new day motion, or are we on the McLennan Shady Brook motion or both?
6928	THE CHAIRMAN: Both.
6929	MR. DAVIES: Let me speak to both then.

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6945 6946 6947 6948 6949 6950 6951	On the issue of the McLennan/Shady Brook motion, that motion really relates to two documents. The first is the transcript from the BCUC hearing that was sent in by Mr. Doherty. The second document relates to some evidence that, additional evidence that VIPLA wanted to put in. Now, we are not <i>carte</i> <i>blanche</i> opposed to late filings. There are some that have occurred today. I think the objective of all of us should be to get in front of the Panel the best and most recent information, subject of course to procedural fairness.
6952 6953 6954	With regard to these two particular documents, I think the VIPLA document has been somewhat overtaken by time. VIPLA, as we now know, has settled with GSX and will not be presenting evidence.
6955 6956 6957 6958 6959 6960	With regard to the CAC document, I frankly don't think that Mr. Doherty ever intended to proffer that transcript as evidence. If you read his cover letter, which is Exhibit C-31-22, he said he was providing it for the assistance of the Panel. He never intended to put up a witness to speak to the document, and in those circumstances it would have been inappropriate to have it adduced as evidence.
6961 6962 6963 6964 6965	So I guess, in sum, the VIPLA document shouldn't go in. VIPLA is not presenting a witness panel anymore, nor should the transcript go in. Mr. Doherty, who was the one who was proffering it, isn't here speaking to it. If anybody had the ability to feel aggrieved it would have been Mr. Doherty and he is not here. So my suggestion is that that motion be denied.
6966	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Mrs. Miller? A reply?
6967 6968	MRS. MILLER: I really feel like I am going to begin to aggravate you and this is not my intention. I am starting off badly on the first day.
6969 6970	I can't even remember anymore what that document was, but I believe do you have the motion in front of you?
6971 6972 6973 6974 6975 6976 6977 6978	Okay. I think our problem was that in the letter sent out that we received very late in the game, we received the document literally moments before the deadline for filing a response on it, and we stayed up Ms McLennan was over at our house yet again until two o'clock in the morning yet again, in order for us to try and play catch up. And we felt that the Panel it seemed that the Panel had sent a letter denying acceptance of some documents because they had been received after a specified deadline. And we felt that, the deadlines notwithstanding, the purpose of the hearing was to bring forward everything that

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6979 would be important to inform the Panel's decision-making process. That is why6980 we wrote that letter.

6981 Mr. Doherty is not here today because I believe that he had made -- he has extreme difficulty in getting over and finding a place to stay, or 6982 commuting back and forth, because his client does not have any funding to sustain 6983 that level of intervention. If my memory serves me correctly, a conditional 6984 appearance was entered for him this morning and that is why he is not here. It is 6985 6986 not because he has no interest in this issue; it's because he has registered a 6987 conditional appearance. Perhaps it would be most expeditious if when Mr. Doherty appears an inquiry was made as to whether or not he still wishes to have 6988 this document placed as an exhibit, or what whatever the proper pro forma is. 6989

If I can just make one more very brief comment. Every time the
words "exhibit" and "evidence" are used I get more and more confused. I made,
or my husband actually, Mr. Miller, made an inquiry of Panel staff last Thursday
as to whether all items on the list of exhibits were considered evidence or whether
they were two different things or whether there existed a list of what the evidence
was, because we are having incredible difficulty disentangling in our minds the
distinction, if there is any, between those two items or words.

6997 We were told by Panel staff that they could not answer this question because that was legal advice, which leaves me even more confused. 6998 6999 And I -- when we were at -- again, my favourite -- at the session yesterday I thought I understood that all items listed on the list of exhibits were evidence 7000 7001 which could be either adopted in person or affirmed by affidavit. And there was 7002 something, which I really didn't catch, which had something to do with if you -- if you are not questioned on it, it is on the list, but you don't have to affirm it unless 7003 you are being cross-examined. I still really have no clear sense, and I do not 7004 believe I am alone in this amongst the intervenors not represented by counsel, I 7005 7006 still have no clear sense of what is an exhibit, what is evidence, what is the relationship between the two, and have I filed any evidence? I don't even know 7007 7008 the answer to that. I am listed as Shady Brook Farm. Shady Brook Farm has things on the list of exhibits, but I myself don't even know if I have evidence or 7009 7010 just exhibits.

And I don't know -- I don't feel that having me bouncing up out of my seat and delaying the proceedings is helpful to anyone. On the other hand, having me not understand what is going on is definitely not helpful for me. What a solution could be, I have no idea. I throw myself on your mercy.

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7015 **MS HANEBURY:** Perhaps, Madam Chair, I could propose a 7016 solution. If Ms Miller wanted to talk to one of the counsel after the hearing, that 7017 would be quite agreeable to us. 7018 **THE CHAIRMAN:** Thank you, Ms Hanebury. 7019 MRS. MILLER: I think that will be wonderful. And could that invitation be expanded to include any other intervenors in the room, like we could 7020 have sort of a -- so I am not the only one getting the information and then it's 7021 7022 broken telephone. Would that be -- like for all of us to ask the question at the same time? I mean in the interests of --7023 7024 **THE CHAIRMAN:** I think if any intervenor has the same 7025 question, of course then they can talk to Ms Hanebury about it. But so far you are 7026 the only one who has raised it. But if other parties have the same issue, of course, 7027 yes. 7028 **MRS. MILLER:** Other people in the meeting that happened last 7029 Thursday where 18 people were sitting in the room, there was general confusion 7030 amongst all 18. I am just the one that happens to have the biggest mouth. 7031 **THE CHAIRMAN:** Thank you for raising that. I think I will 7032 make two quick comments so we can move on. 7033 Regarding the documents filed by CAC from the BCUC, the Panel made a ruling that there was no motion brought forward when that document was 7034 7035 filed. Essentially, if I recall correctly, the document was filed and it was, "Here 7036 you go, Panel; if you are interested, here is material for you." There is no 7037 indication that he, that he wished to rely on that document with respect to his own 7038 evidence and argument, so we couldn't accept it. If he wishes to bring a motion 7039 forward, we will reconsider it. So that was the essence of that decision. I think as Mr. Davies put it nicely, the VIPLA document is really a non-issue now, so there 7040 7041 is no need talking about it. 7042 We have already made a decision regarding the new panel-new day and I would like to summarize that again very briefly. We haven't said we will 7043 7044 not consider other sitting times. We have said that, for example, Mrs. McLennan may wish to have her questions, cross-examination, done by someone else and we 7045 7046 are willing to accommodate her when she presents a final argument by considering an evening session. At this point in time she is the only one who has 7047 7048 made that request to us to have panels available in the evening; but that doesn't 7049 mean that we won't consider. I think this is an alternative I put forward. So that

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7050 7051 7052	decision is not a no. In other words, at least you should have a discussion with her and consider what we are proposing and we are quite willing to accommodate the final argument component of it.
7053	Thank you.
7054	Ms Hanebury?
7055	MS HANEBURY: Before you I would just advise you, Madam
7056	Chair, that before you adjourn today, Mr. Bomford, who had a conditional
7057	appearance registered on his behalf, is here and would like to register his
7058	appearance.
7059	THE CHAIRMAN: Please step forward.
7060	Please state your name for the record, then we will go through our
7061	list of questions for you.
7062	MR. BOMFORD: Jim Bomford.
7063	THE CHAIRMAN: Are you representing yourself?
7064	MR. BOMFORD: I am.
7065	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you wish to do you wish to have an
7066	opening statement and, if so, tomorrow, or on a different day, and when you do
7067	that you lose your ability to cross-examine and present final argument.
7068	MR. BOMFORD: No.
7069	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you wish to cross-examine the
7070	Proponent's panel, witness panels?
7071	MR. BOMFORD: Yes.
7072	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you wish to cross-examine any other
7073	intervenors' panel?
7074	MR. BOMFORD: Yes.

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7075	THE CHAIRMAN: Can you give us an idea about the issues that
7076	you wish to cross-examine on both for the Proponent and for the other intervenors
7077	on the List of Issues, if you can?
7078	MR. BOMFORD: If I can. I am just not sure how much depth
7079	you would like me to go into on that.
7080	THE CHAIRMAN: Just list the numbers, like Issue 1, Issue 2, or
7081	according to the List of Issues that we sent out quite a while ago.
7082	MR. BOMFORD: I don't remember which of the issues is 1, 2, 3,
7083	to be quite honest with you, at this point.
7084	THE CHAIRMAN: Sorry, I think I didn't make that clear. What
7085	I wanted to ask you was: Which panel do you want to cross-examine? Because
7086	there are eight different panels.
7087	MR. BOMFORD: I am not sure. I don't know at this point in
7088	time.
7089	THE CHAIRMAN: Okay.
7090	When you are cross-examining the Proponent or the other
7091	intervenors, just a reminder that sweetheart cross-examination is not allowed. In
7092	other words, cross-examination that you could use the opportunity to bolster one's
7093	position. In other words, we allow cross-examination that is adverse in interest,
7094	but not one that will bolster the other party's position.
7095	MR. BOMFORD: I understand that.
7096	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you wish to present final argument?
7097	MR. BOMFORD: Yes.
7098	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you wish to move down, be moved down
7099	from the list of from the list of parties that we have issued, where you were in
7100	terms of where we have placed you?
7101	MR. BOMFORD: Yes.
7102	THE CHAIRMAN: Where would you like to be?

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7103	MR. BOMFORD: It doesn't necessarily matter. It can be
7104	virtually anywhere. I am one of these people that is going to try and catch as
7105	much as I can on the Internet. I won't be able to attend most of the hearings, most
7106	days. So you are going to perhaps be calling my name and I am not going to be
7107	here often.

7108	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you have any preliminary matters?
7109	MR. BOMFORD: No.
7110	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Bomford.
7111	Mr. Skerik. I think you raised an issue and I particularly didn't
7112	consider it a motion, but you raised an issue on the clarification of alternatives,
7112	and I would just like to refer you to the Panel's letter of 20th January 2003 where
7114	we clarified the Panel's view relative to alternatives to the project and what we
7114	would consider. And I think, after looking at that, if you have additional
7116	concerns, then I would invite you to speak to one of the Panel counsel.
7117	MR. SKERIK: It was May 28th, did you say? What was the date

7119	THE CHAIRMAN: January 20, 2003.
7120	MR. SKERIK: Okay. Thank you.
7121	THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you.
7122	I think we have Mrs. Wright, I believe, who just wishes to make a

7124	MS WRIGHT: Madam Chair, Justice Holmes, Mr. Williams.
7125	Thank you for the opportunity to speak. This is my oral statement to the Joint
7126	Review Panel because I will not be able to come tomorrow evening.
/120	Review I and because I will not be able to come tomorrow evening.
7127	In your message January 20th you note that the Panel is to
7128	determine whether or not the pipeline is or will be required by present and future
7129	public convenience and necessity. You have the right, subject to
7130	Governor-in-Council approval, to issue a section 52 certificate with appropriate
7130	terms and conditions or refuse to issue a certificate.
1111	terms and conditions of refuse to issue a certificate.

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7132 I have read and understand that the Georgia Strait Crossing 7133 Pipeline Project is not required to answer questions related to alternatives. 7134 However, it is appropriate for members of the public to comment on these matters 7135 and to ask you to consider them when you make your decision. 7136 The responsibilities of governments are many and may require 7137 some balance in order to meet or moderate certain competing needs and desires. The classic argument of the last decade or two has been between the principles of 7138 7139 conservation, preserving and protecting the environment for future generations, 7140 and the principles of an economy which provides a livelihood for its citizens, and important for some, creates well for corporations and certain individuals. 7141 7142 Sometimes there is no apparent effort to find a balance. It might even be argued that, in finding a balance, no one's interests are served. The rate of 7143 environmental degradation and the ability to create wealth are both simply slowed. 7144 7145 As a Crown corporation, B.C. Hydro belongs to the people of this province. It exists to serve the people, not just as a source of energy; it also 7146 should be required to serve British Columbia's communities' broader interests. 7147 7148 What are these community interests and in particular as they apply to Vancouver Island Region of B.C.? Short-term interests include sustaining the 7149 7150 level of energy that is now being consumed. Also in the short term, the cost of 7151 energy is a consideration. In the longer term, the need to reduce our use of energy, 7152 particularly from non-renewable or dangerous sources, is paramount. The burning 7153 of hydrocarbons is responsible for greenhouse gases causing global warming and frightening climate change. For this reason, Canada signed the Kyoto agreement a 7154 few months ago. 7155 7156 Less dependence upon sources of energy from outside the community would enhance security of supply while developing new 7157 environmental friendly technologies. As Vancouver Island's communities evolve, 7158 7159 better small to medium business cooperative and individual employment 7160 opportunities are needed. 7161 So what is to be achieved by carrying out the GSX PL project? 7162 The amount of available gas for domestic and industrial use will be enhanced. The ability to generate electricity by burning natural gas will be enhanced. The 7163 7164 enhanceability of natural gas and electricity will encourage greater use by industry, businesses and individuals, and this will be good for sales of petroleum 7165 products and electricity made from them. 7166

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7167 What are the likely effects of this choice? With no encouragement 7168 to be more economical the consumption of natural gas will increase leading to 7169 higher pollution and an increased ecological footprint. While admittedly the 7170 pollution rate of natural gas is not as great as that of oil, natural gas clearly furthers the development of greenhouse gasses. Higher prices and greater 7171 dependence on hydrocarbons will follow. B.C. Hydro and the suppliers of natural 7172 7173 gas will experience increasing profits. Unsustainable growth of both industry and population are a distinct possibility. 7174 7175 What is likely to happen if the project is turned down? The supply

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7175 What is likely to happen if the project is turned down? The supply 7176 of gas will remain the same while the amount of electricity currently available will 7177 continue until at least 2007, according to B.C. Hydro's own estimates. In my 7178 opinion the alleged need for more natural gas has not been demonstrated or 7179 justified. The arguments are largely circular.

Alternatives to natural gas for electrical generation will have to be considered in the longer run. These include the usual list of wind, tide, wave, micro hydro and so on, and other ideas may well emerge. Conservation and reduced consumption will become important. Techniques for conservation already in place in some communities around the globe will become much more familiar in this region. Education will play an important part in promoting this, a task that reasonably would be shared with B.C. Hydro.

7187 While initial costs to modify building as an infrastructure may be
7188 relatively high, long-term relative costs of energy will certainly diminish for users,
7189 producing savings.

With development of alternatives to major electrical generation
methods now used, community-based independent systems will have an
opportunity to develop. Long distance transmission lines, which are less efficient
than community-based short-distance lines, will become increasingly unimportant.
Many communities will be unable to avoid or contribute to the grid.

7195 What are the advantages to be realized from turning down the 7196 project and for whom? Businesses, industry and individuals within communities 7197 will develop their abilities to be more independent and creative. They will have the possibility of living in a healthier environment, of having to stabilize global 7198 7199 warming and climate change, and of playing a part in ensuring a decent world for future generations. Communities will become more democratic and self-reliant, 7200 7201 not only in their development of energy for their own purposes, but in their sense 7202 of community and mutual dependence. Governments need not use highly questionable carbon credits as a way around their global responsibilities. 7203

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7204 What are the liabilities and for whom? Corporations and 7205 governments seeking to put profit before community and the environment may not 7206 be satisfied with returns on investment. 7207 In my own community of Saltspring Island many of our people are beginning to examine seriously alternative locally-produced energy coming from 7208 7209 wave action and current action and the wind. The use of solar energy is also increasing slowly. Many of us look forward to being free of electrical outages not 7210 7211 of local origin. Fixing our own problems will be good for us as we work together 7212 to build a self-reliant but mutually dependent community. Other communities across the country are showing interest in similar projects. 7213 Toronto, for example, has recently placed a large wind turbine just 7214 7215 offshore to provide power and this is a side benefit to cool the downtown during the worst summer heat. 7216 7217 I believe that B.C. Hydro's request and the support for the GSX PL Project is speculative in nature. There appears to be an adequate proof of need 7218 7219 and distinct disadvantages in the long term. I encourage the Panel to deny support 7220 to this project. 7221 I thank you for the opportunity to share my concerns and position 7222 with you. While I speak for myself only in this matter, I have discussed the matter with many friends and associates who hold the same position. Thank you. 7223 7224 THE CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mrs. Wright. Thank you. We 7225 don't have any questions. 7226 Thank you very much. 7227 I believe we have come to the end of our proceeding today. We 7228 will adjourn until 9:30 a.m. tomorrow. 7229 Mr. Davies? 7230 **MR. DAVIES:** I said at the outset, Madam Chair, that I had a few 7231 filings to make. I could do those now or first thing tomorrow morning, whichever you would prefer. If it saves me carrying them back in my bag I would like to do 7232 7233 them now. 7234 **THE CHAIRMAN:** In that case we will go through it. Okay.
