I am a Registered Nurse and in my training and work have learned that the physical environment is an important determinant of health.

Saint John has a large share of industry that already poses risks to its citizens. Many of our citizens suffer from asthma and lung cancer. These risks will be increased by bringing bitumen and other substances mixed with it. The plan to build large storage tanks that will contain these chemicals and will release toxic substances into the air, will only contribute to the increased risk to the people in this city.

The risk of pipelines rupturing and spilling these chemicals into many of the waterways that will cross in this province, is also a grave concern to me. Our family, as many of our citizens, boats and swims in these waters. I know from reading and listening to experts, that the proposed pipeline and the amount of bitumen that is planned to carry, will significantly contribute to tar sands expansion and therefore will contribute to our country's greenhouse emissions. As a citizen, I have an obligation to address climate change. And to demand that the government that represents me, also does.

My children and grandchildren live in this city and any project that plans to increase the risk to their health, forces me to get involved and say no to this project.

I have friends and know people who own property on the proposed path of the pipeline and who are already suffering a great deal of psychological stress from the potential that a pipeline spill may wipe out their life support. We need to promote energy projects that protect our environment and therefore our health. Our country, province, planet, do not need a project that will jeopardize water, people and the environment instead of benefiting us.
